Revelation is God's communication to us of his everlasting love. We find this story of revelation throughout the Bible as God communicates to the people of Israel on their journey of faith which culminates in the person of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

To Discuss at Home:

Share an experience of how you came to know and love Jesus - was it a small experience of growth or a transformative one? Was it over a period of time or was it immediate? In what ways has God revealed himself and his love to you?

Sacraments

To Discuss at Home:

Can you think of some other invisible signs of God's love? What are ways in which you love each other as family members both visibly and invisibly?

Prayer

Prayer is turning the heart toward God. We pray because we are full of an infinite longing and God has created us men for himself: "Our hearts are restless until they rest in you" (St. Augustine). He is always there for us. He seeks us before we seek him; he years for us, he calls us, and prayer is our response back.

To Discuss at Home:

Go around and talk about the different ways everyone likes to pray (or if you don't know, start experimenting!)

Praying the same prayer together is always great, but we should also find our own ways to pray as well.

Community

Christian unity is the business of all Christians, regardless of how young or old they are. Unity was one of Jesus' most important concerns. He prayed to the Father, "That they may all be one ... so that the world may believe that you have sent me" (Jn 17:21). Just as there is only one Christ, there can be only one Body of Christ, only one Bride of Christ, and therefore only one Church of Jesus Christ.
