Happy Good Shepherd Sunday! Today's Gospel focuses on Jesus, the good shepherd, whose sheep recognize His voice and only follow him. This can only happen by repeated exposure to His voice, and not becoming familiar with the voices of thieves. It is meant to show us how we

are to live. Do we take time everyday in the Word of God, becoming familiar with His voice? Or do we spend the majority of our time listening to fearful news or exotic teachers that encourage us to abandon sound Gospel teaching? Does the Word of God, proclaimed in the Scriptures and the Church's teaching, form our identity or do we allow the culture's 'voice' to tell us who we are? Let us make a firm resolution to not listen to any other voice than that of the Good Shepherd, expressed through the Scriptures, the local bishop, and the Catechism.

Please keep me in prayer this week, I will be taking some time for prayer and intensive therapy to continue my ongoing journey to healing from computer game addiction. I've mentioned it in homilies, but as any addict knows, the path to healing takes years of hard work and prayer to address the underlying causes of addiction. I have come a long way, but still have a ways to go before total healing, please God. It has been a long road, but I have confidence in the Lord's plan and am grateful for the opportunity to humble myself in the hopes that my example may encourage others who are struggling to seek the help they need. You are not alone and there is help available in your personal trials. Know of my love and prayers for you in these days.





2nd with a key alone. You will need to also have an alarm code to disarm the system. If you no longer require afterhours access to the church, parish hall or education center, please return any keys to the office.


MAY CROWNING - MAY 14th
