

# Pastor's Corner



Thank you to all who have turned in their pledge envelopes for this year! Your Time, Talent, and Treasure are very much appreciated and needed to keep St. Alice afloat and vibrant! Please turn your family's envelope in as soon as possible so that we can move forward with plans for another great year! Please also pray for our staff as we close the office this week to do some strategic planning and deep cleaning/organizing that has been sorely needed for months!

As you may have heard, 2 weeks ago I was able to attend the 2017 Sacred Liturgy Conference in Medford. It was a great week of workshops, lectures, and beautiful Masses,

with 400 people in attendance from around the U.S.A.-- including many lay leaders, musicians, priests. The keynote speeches were given by several priests and lay leaders, Bishops Vasa and Sample, as well as Cardinal Burke. Topics ranged from the role of chant and sacred music in the liturgy to comparison of different expressions of the Roman Rite throughout history to what the Second Vatican Council actually taught about reform of the Liturgy and music. If anyone is a 'liturgy buff' or just interested in learning more, I purchased the talks for our parish lending library and they should be available in a few weeks for your listening pleasure!

While the talks were pretty good, the masses were amazing—both musically and visually. The 'choreography', if you will, between the priest and servers, schola and congregation was very moving and uplifting, showing the potential of what Mass can be if everyone takes their role seriously as an 'active participant' in the Liturgical action. Indeed, "participatio actuosa" (Active Participation) at Mass was the primary goal of the reforms of the Second Vatican Council! However, 'active participation' has been often misunderstood in our times to mean 'doing something' at Mass. In 1958, an instruction "on Sacred Music" from the Vatican Congregation of Rites had this to say about what active participation really means:

"The Mass of its nature requires that all those present participate in it, in the fashion proper to each. This participation must be primarily interior (i.e. union with Christ the Priest; offering with and through Him). But the participation of those present becomes fuller if to internal attention is joined external participation...such as the position of the body (genuflecting, standing, sitting) ceremonial gestures (Sign of the cross), or in particular, the responses, prayers, and singing...Perfect actual participation (participatio actuosa), finally, is obtained when there is added sacramental participation (by communion)." (qtd. In "Nothing Superfluous" by Rev. Jackson, James FSSP, 10)

We can see from the above instruction that participation at Mass is necessary, but is not primarily about doing something—rather, participation is primarily interior. Not everyone can be a reader at mass, or a server, or a choir member, but all must participate in the worship offered to God. A priest participates primarily by offering the sacrifice of Christ on the altar (as well as himself and the people), but the lay faithful participate by offering themselves to God along with the gifts brought at the offertory. They bring their families, joys, sorrows, and lives to the altar, along with the bread and wine, to be consecrated and transformed by Christ so that everything in our lives can be filled with His presence. If we actively participate in this way, it is impossible to remain unchanged at Mass!

# Did you notice?

#### Who moved my chair!?!

You may have noticed that the priest and server chairs face the altar now as opposed to facing the congregation. Some have asked why. This is because the altar is the focal point of the mass, where heaven and earth meet, and where the 'once-for-all' sacrifice of Jesus on the cross is re-presented to us in an un-bloody manner. All of the congregation are facing toward the altar when they pray, and it was odd that the priest and servers wouldn't also face that direction when they pray. Facing the altar also helps the servers (and the priest) to focus on their task and not be distracted by the congregation. When we all are looking at God together, we have a unified prayer posture and manifest more clearly our unity as the one Body of Christ, head and members.
