Pastor's Corner



Blessed Assumption week! This Tuesday we will be celebrating the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, body and soul, into heaven. It is a holy day of obligation, so please plan on coming to mass at either noon or 6:30pm on Tuesday. The Assumption is one of the 4 Marian dogmas proclaimed by the Church, meaning that all Catholics must believe it to be true! But, if you've studied your history, you know that this dogma was only formally defined in the last century. How then, can it be something so important to the life of the Church?

Well, we have to understand why dogmas are defined and what such a definition means. When a dogma is defined It does NOT mean that the Church now believes something new that it didn't believe before. Rather, a dogma simply makes explicit a part of the faith that previously wasn't disputed. It's like the saying, "If there's a rule against something, it's because somebody did it before!" The Church, in a similar way, only defines things when people are arguing about them. For example, the first Marian Dogma (defined in the year 431) is that Mary is the Mother of God. The Church always believed this, but due to the heresy of the bishop Nestorius who argued against it, it became necessary to say that Mary was not just an incubator for a piece of human flesh that God filled later, but the mother of Jesus, who is one Divine person with 2 natures, human and divine. Therefore, Mary, as the mother of a Divine person (Jesus), IS the mother of God. Ultimately, the definition was made to clarify the identity of Jesus as God, which, as a secondary consequence, means that Mary is the "Theotokos", the Mother of God.

The other two Marian dogmas are: 1) The Perpetual Virginity of Mary--Mary was a virgin before, during, and after the birth of Jesus; 2) The Immaculate Conception—through a singular grace, the merits of the cross of Jesus were applied beforehand to Mary, preserving her from all stain of original sin. In addition, she never intentionally committed sin during her lifetime.

The fourth Marian dogma, the Assumption, defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950, simply draws out the implications of the previous Marian dogmas, especially the Immaculate Conception. "Mary, Immaculate Mother of God ever Virgin, after finishing the course of her life on earth, was taken up in body and soul to heavenly glory." (Munificentissimus Deus, P. Pius XII) I recommend reading the whole encyclical as it contains a rich scriptural, liturgical, and historical foundation for our faith in this teaching. Please also check out "The Bible and the Virgin Mary" on www.formed.org for more teaching on Mary and the Scriptures!

Next Sunday (August 20th), our Youth Minister Jason Roebuck and I will be having a "Youth Synod" in the parish center to give our youth (high school) and Young adults (single and married) a chance to tell us what they need from St. Alice. If you know of youth in our parish who aren't here, please pass the word along to them! Young people, I want to hear from you what your needs are so that we can serve you better—and I'd rather not guess what you need! If you are a youth or young adult, please plan on attending at 3pm next Sunday to fill me in and be a part of the conversation for improving our parish. Come with your smart devices if you have them so that we can also fill out an online youth survey for Pope Francis if you haven't done that yet. I look forward to meeting with you-please pray for us!






