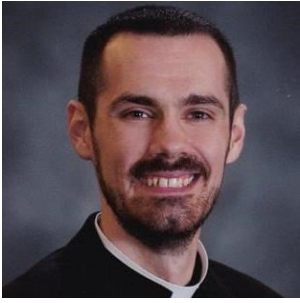

Pastor's Corner



Since we're back into "Ordinary Time" we're just going to kick back and relax, right? Hardly! It's a new year and there's lots of great things happening here at St. Alice.

One important item I'd like to highlight is our draft "Parish Mission Statement" which we included in the bulletin last week and again this week. Please read the article carefully if you haven't already, as we want your feedback before we ratify the final version. I want to simply talk about what the statement means in its current form: "Seek Jesus, build relationships, and show all of Springfield the way to Heaven". Each phrase is active, because the mission is something we do with God's help.

The first phrase, "Seek Jesus", is primary. The first commandment is to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul, and strength." If anything we do as a parish isn't about growing more in love with Jesus and his body the Church, we need to stop doing it. We want to encounter Jesus in our private prayer and worship at Mass, learn more about His teaching, and cultivate holiness in our lives by imitating Him. Our relationship with Jesus, both personally and as a church, is primary. He wants a deep intimacy with each one of us; 'seeking Him first' needs to be our life's goal!

The second phrase, "Build relationships", is about the second commandment, "Love your neighbor as yourself". We are not a 'spiritual truck-stop' where people pass through to get sacraments! We are a family—and we are growing! St. Alice is well known in the area for its warm hospitality, especially to families with children. We also are a multicultural community, which presents unique opportunities and challenges to stay united as one parish. "Building relationships" with other parishioners of different ages and cultures will help us all rejoice in the rich diversity of the Church—a diversity that is united in the one Spirit, and the one Faith revealed by Christ. Our activities should foster authentic, supportive relationships with each other in Christ.

The third phrase, "Show all of Springfield the way to Heaven", is about outreach to our 'mission field': the city of Springfield. We need to lead by example, not by word only. "See how they love one another" should be on the lips of non-believers in our town. By our love for our own members, and our service in the community to the poor and marginalized, people will see that the Catholic Church lives what it teaches—love for God and neighbor. And by our proclamation of the Truth with love, people will see an alternative to the lies of the culture. The world is lost in darkness and sin, rejecting even the truth about human nature as male and female! People are truly "tossed about by every wind of false doctrine" from world leaders and media personalities. While promising to give people freedom, the mindset of the world only brings slavery, human misery, and ultimately death and hell. Jesus offers us life! Jesus has conquered sin and hell, inviting all to taste true freedom through the grace of the sacraments and living a holy Christian life. He has commissioned each one of us, as members of His Church, to bring the saving truth of the Gospel to the world, to save people from the way that leads to eternal death. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them...and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Mt 28:19-20) Our parish is tasked with building God's kingdom in Springfield, giving us focus and purpose to our charitable and evangelistic outreach.

If you have any feedback about the mission statement, please leave a comment in the box in the entrance to the church or contact the Pastoral council chair (her email is in the article). Any changes to wording will be taken into consideration and ratified at the January 24th meeting.

**Pastoral Council Issues Draft Mission Statement and
Initiates Comment Period on
St. Alice Parish
MISSION STATEMENT DRAFT**

Good things don't always happen quickly – and such is the case with the time and talent poured into our St. Alice Parish draft mission statement. You may remember that in July, we convened a meeting of Parish leadership who brainstormed – from many different and relevant perspectives – to create several concise and poignant draft mission statements. These drafts were placed before the Pastoral Council to synthesize, edit, and ultimately bring forward a unified draft mission statement for parishioners to consider, with the goal of adoption of the official St. Alice Catholic Church Mission Statement by the Pastoral Council at its meeting on January 24, 2018.

You may ask, “Why does a church need a mission statement?” The answer to this question is similar to the answer that might be given by a business or any service organization: *to establish a yardstick by which all of St. Alice’s programs, projects, and initiatives can be measured* to assure that we are focusing the church’s time, talents, and resources in a way that will accomplish our parish’s priorities.

After several months of discussion, synthesis, and editing, the Pastoral Council presents the following draft mission statement – in both English and Spanish – for your review and comment:

Seek Jesus, build relationships, and show all of Springfield the way to Heaven.

Busca a Jesus, construye Relaciones, y muestra a todo Springfield el camino al Cielo.

The Pastoral Council asks that you prayerfully consider this proposed mission statement – from the perspective of your primary language – and offer your comments and/or suggestions to the Pastoral Council by January 22nd. You may send your comments via email to Peg Ries, Pastoral Council chair, at grammy3xpeg@comcast.net, or drop your comments in the Pastoral Council’s Comment Box in the vestibule. A sub-committee of the Pastoral Council will document and review all comments submitted and present a recommendation to the entire Pastoral Council for adoption of the official St. Alice Catholic Church mission statement at its meeting on January 24, 2018.
