

Pastor's Corner



This Sunday we hear Psalm 95 at mass. Psalm 95 is probably one of the most important in the bible. Every priest and religious person prays it at the beginning of their day when they recite the Liturgy of the Hours. "If today you hear the voice of the Lord, harden not your hearts." That one phrase, repeated daily, becomes a reminder as we start the day: God is speaking to you and inviting you to go deeper today—will you listen? God will speak in the events of the day and in your prayer—are you open to following God's inspiration today? Or, like the Israelites in the desert, will we simply ignore God and go on

doing whatever we want? You see, I think this psalm needs to be on everyone's lips, not just priests and religious. Listen to it and see how it lays out the plan for a holy life—a life leading to heaven.

"O come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation! Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise! For the Lord is a great God, and a great King above all gods. In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also. The sea is his, for he made it; for his hands formed the dry land. O come, let us worship and bow down, let us kneel before the Lord, our Maker! For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand. O that today you would listen to his voice! Harden not your hearts, as at Meribah, as on the day at Massah in the wilderness, when your fathers tested me, and put me to the proof, though they had seen my work. For forty years I was wearied of that generation and said, "They are a people who err in heart, and they do not regard my ways."

Therefore I swore in my anger that they should not enter my rest." (Ps 95:1-11)

It starts with worship of God, recognizing He made everything and deserves our praise. Half of the psalm is praising God for who He is and what He has made. That's really important, because often we focus on what's wrong with everything in the world—but that will not give us joy! While we need to be aware of evil in our world, we can never lose sight of God's providence in everything, whether good or evil. We already know the end of the story, that all will be well for those who love God and serve Him faithfully—we need to remind ourselves of this every day by praising God as our first habit of the day, before looking at our phones!

The second half flows from the first; God who loves his creation, is asking a response from us. The Israelites complained against God and disobeyed Him at every turn, even though God set them free from slavery and fed them with bread from heaven. "They put me to the proof, though they had seen my work...they do not regard my ways." And as a result, they are deprived of entering the promised land. How could they be so hard of heart? In the same way that we can be! If we don't think about what God does for us—setting us free from slavery to sin and death in Baptism and Reconciliation, feeding us with 'bread from heaven' at mass—we take God for granted and lose sight of heaven. Many people never go to confession, thinking they don't need it! How hard their hearts have become! They can't see that they are in danger of losing paradise. We all need God's mercy, and need to ask for it every day. Realize that Psalm 95 is not just about the Israelites, but you and me. Every day, we have a choice to make: will we 'listen' to God, calling to mind the blessings we've received in the sacraments, and joyfully respond to God today? Or will we focus on ourselves and what we want, until that 'voice' becomes unrecognizable? God is speaking; may our hearts not be hard today.



ARCHDIOCESE OF PORTLAND IN OREGON OFFICE OF DIVINE WORSHIP

Recently, the Office of Divine Worship has received inquiries regarding the celebration of Holy Mass during the flu season. Inquiries have sought guidance regarding certain liturgical practices and concerns over the transmission of the cold and/or the flu.

The following guidelines are offered:

- 1. While communion under both species has "a more complete form as a sign when it is received under both kinds," [GIRM 281], it is not always necessary or advisable.
- 2. It is left to the prudent judgment of the pastor whether communion under both kinds should be offered during a period in which there is a high incidence of colds and the flu.
- 3. If Communion under both kinds is retained those who are not feeling well should refrain from receiving from the chalice, and should receive Holy Communion under the form of bread alone to avoid transmitting any illness.
- 4. Due to the fact that our hands are often transmitters of the cold and flu, care should be taken that:
 - a. No one should ever be permitted to self-intinct (dip) the consecrated host into the Precious Blood. The practice is prohibited by law and its result can be the unknowing transmission of illness.
 - b. In place of the regular way of offering the sign of peace a nod of the head and a verbal greeting of peace rather than the shaking of hands during this cold and flu season may be used.
 - c. Holding hands during the Our Father should be discouraged.
- 5. Those who are Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion in the parish church or those involved in ministry to the homebound should take special precautions. They should heed all health directives by frequently washing their hands and avoiding contact with others, especially those most susceptible to illness.
- 6. Catholics who are ill are excused from Sunday worship out of respect and concern for their fellow worshipers. Catholics who are ill may make a spiritual communion during the time of their illness.




