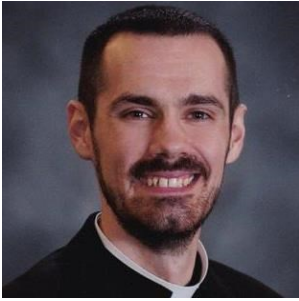

## Pastor's Corner



God is faithful and full of surprises! We started tearing off the old roof on Monday and found out that there was no plywood underneath! So, that added about \$10,000 to the project, but thankfully we had a cushion from the savings in materials costs and labor costs from the contractor and a parishioner who owns a roofing materials company. I'll keep you posted on the progress, but it's going well and St. Joseph is helping out a lot in the reconstruction of our parish!

We have also just posted two new part-time positions for St. Alice: one for youth ministry and the other for marriage/family ministry. Please see the job descriptions and ask the Lord if He is calling YOU to apply. These positions are critical—our youth and families are in need of being fortified and equipped to face the very real challenges of a hostile and sinful culture. If your heart is stirred to help evangelize and serve families, please consider joining our team in the work Christ has given us to do as a Church.

Another new thing is that, starting next week, we are changing the bulletins. Instead of printing them ourselves, we will be contracting with Catholic Printery (who does many of the other Church bulletins in the area). The cost of the bulletins will be completely subsidized by advertisers, and I want to thank in advance all of the parish businesses who will support this aspect of our Church's mission. Please show gratitude to them by supporting their businesses!

Speaking of gratitude, I want to give thanks publicly to David Meile, who has been the bulletin compiler for us these last several years. He has faithfully served us in this difficult task, which often is a thankless job! Thank you David for your service, and may God reward you abundantly for the sacrifices you made for us at St. Alice!

Lastly, I want to thank all of you for the kind words and congratulations on the news of my being appointed Pastor of St. Alice. My heart is very glad to serve you and to be here for a while. I'm looking forward to putting down roots and growing with you. As I've been reflecting on my duties to provide for your spiritual needs, I realized that I have (at least) two problems—not enough time to do spiritual direction and not enough confession times available for the parish. Therefore, starting in July, I will be adjusting my schedule to have 2 hours of confession/spiritual direction time each day during the week with the exception of Monday and Sunday. To make this happen, I won't be taking personal appointments anymore, with the exception of marriage and funeral preparation, and home/hospital visits. If you have a spiritual need and you call the office, Eva will direct you to come see me in the church during the times I'm there. If it's more of a quick question, she'll direct you to my voicemail and we can talk about it over the phone. This change should make me more available to you and encourage regular confession as I've been preaching about for the last two years. If we go to confession regularly, we will be spiritually healthy. Many of our problems come from unconfessed sin or unforgiveness. A good confession is transformational. Remember that we must go to confession at least once a year, and I'm recommending once a month if you want to be a saint! Now my schedule permits that possibility so please take advantage of it! God is good!

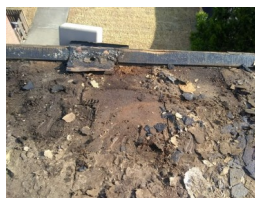

## PARISH JOB OPENING YOUTH MINISTER

**General Statement of Duties:** To foster the total personal and spiritual growth of young people, to empower them to live as disciples of Jesus Christ in today's world, and to draw them into responsible participation in the life, mission, and work of the Catholic faith community. Provides leadership in the design, implementation and evaluation of the youth ministry program for youth and young adults within the church community. Coordinates the spiritual, educational, ministerial and social activities of youth and young adults within the Church community. Position is part-time and reports to the Pastor/Pastoral Associate.

### **Essential Functions/Major Responsibilities:**

1. Works with the Pastor and with other staff members to integrate youth into active participation in parish life.
2. Responsible for the planning, implementation, and evaluation of a parish program for youth that is consistent with the parish mission statement and involves opportunities for spiritual, service, and social activities with emphasis on faith formation. Plans and organizes liturgical celebrations, service projects, retreats, and social functions for the program participants.
3. Coordinates and maintains a calendar of youth program activities with the calendars of the parish, vicariate and archdiocese.
4. Recruits and trains adult volunteers to help with the youth program and to assist as catechists in the faith formation of young adolescents, Jr. High, (when appropriate) and older adolescents, High School. Selects and trains youth as leaders and peer ministers for the youth program. Provides for the faith formation of all volunteers.
5. Prepares and submits an annual youth ministry budget that is consistent with the planned youth program to the Pastor for approval. Monitors expenditures against the approved budget and organizes fund raising events as needed to help supplement the cost of program activities/events.
6. Collaborates in developing a structured religious education program. Promotes active youth participation within parish liturgical life.
7. Plans, develops, and leads confirmation program, and secures necessary texts and materials. Observes national and archdiocesan guidelines regarding youth ministry and religious education policies.
8. Keeps parents informed as to program mission and activities, and invites them to become involved in the program.
9. Networks with youth ministers in vicariate, region and archdiocese to plan combined events and share resources.
10. Participates in Archdiocesan opportunities for developing youth ministry skills. Attends Archdiocesan youth events with parish youth. Tends to their own spiritual growth through prayer life and retreats.
11. Maintains a strict level of confidentiality on all matters relating to parish business.

**Job Scope:** Position encounters frequent new and varied work situation. Incumbent determines own practices and procedures and contributes to the development of new concepts. Position operates independently with minimal supervision. Improper individual actions could result in delays and errors in paperwork and interactions, as well as poor public relations. Contacts are usually made with others both inside and outside the parish. Contact may be made by own initiative, or by supervisor request, and sometimes contain confidential/sensitive matters.

**Specific Job Skills** Proven ability in organizational and communications skills and an understanding of adolescent faith development. Must be able to prioritize workload to meet program requirements. Ability to work both independently and as a member of a pastoral team. Must be flexible, creative, and responsible.

**Education and/or Experience:** Practical experience working with youth. Demonstrated commitment to youth (grades 6-12) and ability to work with them and their families. Certification for Youth Ministry from the Archdiocese or equivalent education preferred. Degree in Pastoral ministry (theology) and two to four years of experience with youth programs in a parish preferred. Practicing Catholic required. Bilingual in Spanish preferred. Valid driver's license required. Current CPR and/or First Aid card preferred.

**Physical Demands:** While performing the duties of this job, the employee is required to stand, walk, talk, reach, sit, hear, handle and perform repetitive motions of the hands/wrists. Individual must be able to lift and carry up to 20 pounds.

**Job Conditions:** Work is normally performed in an office, youth room, classroom, liturgical or recreational setting. Employee will be required to attend scheduled evening and weekend meetings and functions. This position requires flexible work scheduling to properly administer the program

**PARISH JOB OPENING  
MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE COORDINATOR**

**General Statement of Duties:** Serves the parish in family-related areas such as marriage preparation and enrichment, family ministry and natural family planning. The family life minister works to implement the mission, goals and objectives of the Archdiocese as they pertain to marriage and family life. Position is part-time and reports to the Pastor/Pastoral Associate.

**Essential Functions/Major Responsibilities:**

1. Coordinates with parish staff to develop a comprehensive family ministry by means of assessing parish needs and developing programs in response to family life needs.
2. Invites, motivates and trains family life volunteers in aspects of family life ministry.
3. Assists pastor and parish staff with parish marriage preparation process.
4. Facilitates family life education and enrichment opportunities for parents and children in the areas of marriage enrichment, natural family planning, and parenting.
5. Facilitates outreach efforts to formerly married (separated, divorced, widowed) and remarried.
6. Provides local referrals to parties seeking professional services such as counseling, speakers, and other contacts.
7. Coordinates with the parish's Family Life Committee of the parish or pastoral council regarding family life activities and ministry.
8. Informs parishioners of upcoming parish, diocesan, or community family life events and resources.
9. Prepares and manages an annual budget.
10. Cooperates with Archdiocesan Marriage and Family Life Office for long-range planning in the scope of marriage and family life concerns.
11. Performs other work-related duties as requested.

**Job Scope:** Position encounters varied work situations with a moderate degree of complexity. Minister operates in collaboration with other staff members and receives moderate supervision. Contacts are made with others both inside and outside the workplace. Contacts are made at own initiative, or at supervisor's request, and may contain confidential/sensitive matters.

**Specific Job Skills:** Proven ability to organize and communicate the principles of Catholic family life teachings in a pastoral manner. Ability to communicate verbally (oral presentations) and in writing. Ability to work independently and as a member of a pastoral team. Ability to develop a pastoral vision for family ministry assessing family strengths and needs in the parish community. Ability to make decisions, to foster the church's mission and to engage in problem analysis and theological/pastoral analysis.

**Education and/or Experience:** Bachelor's degree and minimum of 2 years' experience in a diocese or parish or any equivalent combination of education and experience which demonstrates the knowledge, skills and abilities to perform the above-described functions. Familiarity with and commitment to the teaching of the Church pertaining to marriage and family life, e.g., Documents of the Second Vatican Council, Plan of Pastoral Action for Family Ministry, Familiaris Consortio, Humanae Vitae, and the Family Perspective in Church and Society. Practicing Catholic required. Valid driver's license required. Bilingual in Spanish preferred.

**Physical Demands:** While performing the duties of this job, the employee is required to stand, walk, talk, reach, sit, hear, handle and perform repetitive motions of the hands/wrists. Individual must be able to lift and carry up to 20 pounds.

**Job Conditions:** Work is performed in a church or office setting. This position requires flexible work scheduling to properly administer the program in order to attend, organize, or manage evening and/or weekend meetings.

## ST. ALICE RECEIVES MATCHING GRANTS FOR FIVE SAFETY-RELATED PROJECTS

St. Alice has received five grants totaling \$10,000 from the Archdiocese "Safety First" grant program for projects that protect people and property by reducing exposure to risk. ***A dollar for dollar match is required for all Safety First grants awarded, and therefore, the \$10,000 in funds granted represents only half the cost of the projects.***

Safety Modifications to Confessional and Cry Room will improve safety and security for our priest and penitents in the confessional and parents and children in the cry room by constructing alternative exits in both.

Estimated Cost: \$10,649.70 Grant Award: \$5,324.35

Campus-wide Rekeying Project will allow the parish to establish a true master key system by standardizing interior and exterior locks, modifying unnecessary exterior doors in two buildings to make them "exit only," and implementing a comprehensive key management program.

Estimated cost: \$3,435.30. Grant Award: \$1,717.65.

24-hour Keycard Access to the Chapel will provide the additional security necessary to allow the parish to move forward toward the goal of offering Perpetual Adoration in the Chapel.

Estimated cost: \$2,465. Grant Award: \$1,232.50.

Replacement of the Offertory Depository Safe in the Sacristy will increase the security of offertory funds (stored there over weekends) by replacing the current much smaller safe that no longer meets our needs.

Estimated cost: \$1,562.50. Grant Award: \$781.25.

Re-striping and Improvements to Parking Lots will help to more clearly delineate driving lanes, parking slots, and ADA stalls, and repair surface cracks to prevent potential potholes and trip-and-fall hazards.

Estimated Cost: \$1,291. Grant Award: \$645.50.
