

EASTER VIGIL
AFTER EPISTLE:

RESPONSORIAL PSALM [ABC]

Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

The following Alleluia is repeated three times, each time a whole tone higher:

Al - le - - - lu - ia.

The first Alleluia is written in a 7/8 time signature with a key signature of three flats (B-flat, E-flat, A-flat). The melody is on a single treble clef staff, and the piano accompaniment is on grand staff (treble and bass clefs). The lyrics are 'Al - le - - - lu - ia.' with a long dash under 'ia'.

Again, a whole tone higher:

Al - le - - - lu - ia.


Finally, a final whole tone higher. This final Alleluia will then be repeated as the response (marked R.) to the psalm verses on the following page.

Al - le - - - lu - ia.


