Sacramental Schedule

Reconciliation: Saturdays 11am-12pm, 4:15-4:45pm Anytime in the rectory – call ahead

Baptism: most Sundays at 1:30pm.

Requirements: baptism preparation class, arrangements are made at least 3 MONTHS prior to the date of the baptism. Sponsors and Christian witnesses need verification of belonging to a Church.

Anointing of the Sick: anyone who is ill and or would like to receive Communion is asked to call the rectory.

Marriage: Couples planning marriage must notify the Parish Rectory at least ONE YEAR in advance for date and necessary info. Pre-Cana classes and F.O.C.C.U.S. Program etc. are required. At least one party must be a registered member of this parish.

Parish Membership

All new families who live within our boundaries are welcome to the parish. They are requested to register at the rectory. If a parishioner is not registered, it is difficult for us to issue testimonial letters, recommendations, references, etc. When you move or change your address, please notify the rectory beforehand. Anyone 18 years of age/older not in school must be registered separate of their family. Thank you.

"Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you." LUKE 14:13-14

One of the main principles of living a stewardship lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.

Reflection

Last weekend's Gospel gave us some important reminders. We can often get caught up in things of this world where we feel competitive with our fellow brothers and sisters, and we compare ourselves to others. We should be focusing on what God is calling us to do - spreading love, light, compassion, and the Good News of Christ to others. It's not a competition because we are all on our own unique journey. We are called to love everyone without stipulation and to forgive others, even those who have wronged us. If we hope to pass through the narrow gate to the Heavenly Kingdom someday, we must try our best to be the people God calls us to be each day. We must find something – any way we can – each day to help someone else. Even if it seems small and insignificant, a series of small, good works make a big impact. By doing this, you not only are doing what God calls you to do, but it is also an opportunity to bring you closer to God. What are some ways that you feel close to God? Now is the time to make sure that you're living a life that not only you are proud of, but one that God would be proud of.



Spiritual Adoption Program The Seventh Month

At seven months after conception, your spiritually adopted child's four senses of vision, hearing, touch and taste are fully functioning. The mother has made plans either to bring the child home or place the child for adoption. "Jesus, Lord of life, thank you for the miracle of life that this child gives awesome witness to."

Pastors Column : August 27 – 28, 2022

Can you believe this is the last weekend in August? Summer always goes quickly -and this year it really flew! Of course, my move probably had something to do with making it seem like the whole season got away quickly.

As we approach the end of summer, it's good to think about the parish programs and things that will get up and running in the Fall. One of these is RCIA – the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. This is a process by which converts are welcomed into the Catholic Church. It is also the way that adults who were Baptized as Catholics, but never made their First Communion or Confirmation, prepare for and receive those sacraments.

I would ask each of you to think of people you know who would benefit from RCIA. Perhaps you have relatives and friends – perhaps even spouses – who have never made their Confirmation or Communion. Maybe you know people who were never Baptized. Or people who are married to Catholics – and may even attend Church with their Catholic spouse or family – but never took the step of converting to our Faith. Very often such people have been thinking about this but did not know what to do. RCIA is for just such people.

RCIA is generally a low - key series of meetings in which topics pertaining to the Faith are explained. The idea is to help the participants learn about the Catholic Faith – on an adult level – so they can prayerfully decide whether or not God is leading them to it.

If you know people who might benefit from this process, please direct them to us at the Parish Office. We can answer questions they have and help them decide if RCIA is for them. We can also help them get started and be available to them throughout the process.

Over the years, I have found working with people in the RCIA to be very fulfilling and inspiring. It is wonderful to see people learning and growing in the Faith through the process. I find it builds my own faith.

Indeed, helping people get started in the RCIA is one way that each of us can fulfill Jesus' command to 'teach all nations' about Him. So is making sure the elementary and middle school aged children in our families are registered for and attend CCD. I spoke about this in last week's bulletin – and want to thank those who spread the word. Our Religious Education Director told me we had a number of registrations last week. Thanks!

Please know that – if there is any hardship in paying Religious Education fees – you just have to let me know. No child or family will be denied CCD instruction in our parish for that reason. It is a privilege for our parish to make sure that all of her families have access to Religious Education for their children.

Remember that we will restart the 7 AM weekday Mass this Thursday, September 1. We will have that Mass on weekday mornings – Monday thru Friday – except on Federal holidays (like Labor Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day, etc.) I look forward to celebrating this Mass with that faithful early morning crowd. It's a great way to start the day.

Thanks to all who have been letting me know their thoughts on changing the current 8 AM Daily Mass to a later time. Based on what I have heard, we will move the 8 AM daily Mass to 8:30 AM Monday – Friday also beginning September 1. Mass intentions currently scheduled for the 8 AM Mass will be transferred to the 8:30 AM Mass. Saturday morning Mass will remain at 8 AM for the time being.

Please remember to say that Hail Mary for me each day. I appreciate that many of you are doing so – and that so many of you have taken a moment to tell me that you are praying for me. God pours out so many blessings and graces to us in answer to our prayers for each other. Let's also remember to pray for the sick and for peace.

<u>First Class –</u> The first class of the 2022 – 2023 year will be the following week, Monday, September 19, 2022. Classes meet from 6:00 – 7:15.

Take Note! – Time Change for 6th and 7th grade classes

Although the registration form indicates classes for 6th and 7th grade will be from 7:30 - 8:45, based on the number of students registered for classes, we will be able to accommodate classes for all grade levels during a single session, from 6:00 - 7:15.

First Grade Update

We now have 20 students registered for first grade. Although higher than last week, the number still seems low. Please, if you have a first grader and haven't gotten around to registration yet, the time to register is now! If you know parents of first graders, please encourage them to submit the registration for their children. Remember, preparation for First Communion is a two-year process that begins in first grade. I made more copies of the registration form and left them in the entrance area of the Church. You can also download the form from the parish website.

Registration Fees

It appears the registration fee has not yet been paid by quite a few families. Please remember to send it in! (\$125 for first child, \$100 each for each additional child) If there are any hardships, please let Fr. John Barbella know – no child will be turned away.


