All new families who live within our boundaries are welcome to the parish. They are requested to register at the rectory.



2023 Lenten Obligations

1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (see note below with regards to March 17).

3. The obligation of fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. Fasting in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal and two smaller meals which together are not equal to a full meal, so as to experience hunger.

4. The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14. Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.

Note: This year, the Memorial of St. Patrick falls on a Friday. For members of the faithful celebrating this Memorial and who desire it, Bishop Checchio has commuted the penitential obligation on March 17 to the obligation to abstain from meat on another day that same week.

Pastors Column : February 18 - 19, 2023

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday – the beginning of the Holy Season of Lent. Masses will be offered in our Church that day at 7and 8:30 AM and at 12 Noon, 4 PM, and 7 PM. Ashes will be blessed and distributed at all those Masses.

There are several ways of looking at Lent. Some people see it simply as a time of penance. We give up treats to show that we are sorry for our sins and want to do better in the future. This is a good way of looking at Lent.

Other people look at Lent as a time to do something extra for God. They go to Daily Mass or practice extra charity as a way of going the extra mile for God during this holy season. This is also a good way of looking at Lent.

I personally think that it's best to see Lent as a little of both. It is indeed a time of penance – but also a time for spiritual growth. This means that we make the most of Lent by both repenting of sin and doing something extra for God! There will be many opportunities to do this in our parish this Lent.

Among the best opportunities for spiritual growth will be our Parish Lenten Mission. It will take place on a series of Tuesday evenings beginning at 7 PM. Every Tuesday (except that of Holy Week) a different priest or deacon will expose the Blessed Sacrament, preach a Lenten homily, and give Benediction. Each Tuesday evening, we will have at least one priest hearing Confessions, for those who wish to receive that sacrament. I encourage everyone to attend at least one – if not all – of these evenings. You can see the full schedule, including the priest and deacons who will be conducting each evening, elsewhere in this bulletin.

We will – of course – pray the Stations of the Cross in Church every Friday of Lent. In addition to the usual 7 PM Stations, we will also have them at 3 PM this year. My hope is that having an afternoon time for Stations will make it easier for those who cannot come at night. Praying the Stations of the Cross is a great way to remember what Jesus did for us on Good Friday – and to do something extra for Him! I hope that every family in our parish comes to Stations of the Cross at least once – if not every Friday – this Lent.

Rice Bowls will be distributed as a means of helping us practice charity this Lent. As usual, I encourage every family to take one and fill it up this Lent. A good way to do this is to put spare change in it each day – or to eat a simple meal once a week this Lent and put the money saved in the Rice Bowl for the poor.

Confessions will be heard every Saturday during Lent from 11 AM - 12 Noon and from 4:15 - 4:45 PM. They will also be heard every Tuesday from 7 - 8 PM during the Lenten Mission. Every Catholic who is able to do so should make a good Confession this Lent. Booklets with reflections for every day of Lent are available for you to take in the Church lobby. Additionally, I have acquired about 200 books entitled 'the Cure of Ars.' As many of you know, the Cure of Ars is the 'nickname' of our parish patron saint – Saint John Vianney. I encourage any adult or older teen who wants to learn more about this holy man to take and read one of these books.

For those who want to go a bit deeper with this book, I will lead a book study on it. We will offer two times: Fridays March 17th, 24th, and 31st at 3:30 PM (right after the 3 PM Stations of the Cross) or Thursdays March 16th, 23rd, and 30th at 7 PM. I hope some of you will join me for this book study – as I am sure that learning more about St. John Vianney will inspire you and build up your faith. While it is not necessary to register for the book study, it might be helpful if those intending to participate call Stephanie at the parish office and let her know.

My hope is that everyone will take advantage of these opportunities to repent of our sins and do something extra for God this Lent. Indeed, let's all resolve to make this the best Lent of our lives – so that we can celebrate Jesus' resurrection this Easter with our faith renewed and reenergized!!

I hope you all enjoyed Superbowl Sunday as much as I did. It was a great evening with my mother, some family, some friends, and a lot of good food at the my sister's home. Regardless of the game, it is always good to be with family and friends.

Please remember to pray a Hail Mary for me today and every day – and have a great week.

Looking for Volunteers for the 2023 – 2024 year

Some of the classes this year have more children than ideal, so if we can round up some additional catechists for next year, we can hopefully reduce the number of students in each class. With the fingerprinting, background check and classes required to volunteer to be around children, the sooner volunteers step forward, the better!

Before I comment on the role of volunteers in our religious education program, I'll comment on the acronym just about everyone uses -CCD. Ever wonder what the letters CCD stand for? CCD is the acronym for Confraternity of Christian Doctrine where confraternity refers to an association of the faithful. CCD dates back to the Council of Trent (1545 – 1563). The confraternity provided religious education to both children and adults who lacked formal religious education. In the early twentieth century Pope St. Pius X wrote an encyclical in which he stated that the express purpose of CCD was for religion classes for the young people who frequent the public schools. And that is pretty much what the average Catholic today knows about CCD – it is religion classes for public school kids.

What goes on in CCD classes at St. Johns?

- We promote knowledge of the Catholic faith. There is a lot of "stuff" Catholics need to know! Remember, we cannot hope to live it if we do not know it! And, if we are serious about wanting to live as Catholics, we'll ask questions. We'll want to know.
- We promote meaningful participation in the Mass and other Sacraments. The Eucharist defines who we are. Showing up at Mass is a start. But we are looking for active participation.
- We present and discuss the teachings of the Church on various moral issues. What does the Church teach about abortion? About marriage? About any number of moral issues we see in the news? Our moral formation cannot be based on what we see in the secular media.
- We teach how to pray. Our teacher is the Master. "Lord, teach us to pray...."
- We promote witnessing to Jesus Christ wherever we are. But we can't be sent out to be a witness unless we have first been prepared. We are sent out on mission at the end of every Mass. Go in peace to love and serve the Lord. We have an obligation to do just that.

Sound impossible? It would be if we were going about this on our own. We're not. This is not our work. It is God's work. With God's grace, His work will be done.
