April 2, 2023 Palm Sunday

"As they were marching out, they came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name; this man they pressed into service to carry His cross." MATTHEW 27:32

The Lord calls us to love God and to love our neighbor. Every day we are presented with opportunities to love our neighbor and help him "carry His cross." These opportunities aren't usually big events, they are usually ordinary occurrences like helping someone carry their groceries or holding the door open for them. The key is putting the other person's needs before our own and not expecting anything in return.

Saint of the Week: St. Isidore of Seville



St. Isidore grew up in Seville along with his three siblings who are also saints. He succeeded his older brother as Archbishop and reunited Spain through his faith teachings. St. Isidore is often called the *Schoolmaster of the Middles*

Ages, as he compiled a dictionary, encyclopedia, and treatises on multiple topics. He is very well known for his prolific writing and his very progressive faith teachings. St. Isidore has become the patron saint of computers and the internet, as he was very ahead of his time with the way he thought, spoke, and taught. 2023 Lenten Obligations

- 1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (see note below with regards to March 17).
- 3. The obligation of fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. Fasting in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal and two smaller meals which together are not equal to a full meal, so as to experience hunger.
- 4. The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14. Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.

Pontifical Good Friday Collection

Pope Francis has asked our parish to support the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land, where they are now less than 2% of the population. Your support is essential to help the Church minister in parishes, provide Catholic Schools, and offer religious education. The Pontifical Good Friday Collection also helps to preserve the sacred shrines of Christianity, including Jerusalem, Nazareth, and Bethlehem. Pastors Column: April 1 - 2, 2023

Last weekend was a busy one in our parish. On Friday we had sold out Tricky Tray at the school. It was nice to see so many people working together and having a good time together to support our parish school and all it does for our children.

On Saturday about half of our 8th grade parish school and CCD students made their Confirmation retreat. By the time you read this, the rest will have made their retreat as well. They went through a series of scripture – based activities, watched a short movie and listened to a story about a saint, and had some discussions about these things as a way of deepening their understanding of what Confirmation is all about. It was pleasure to be with them – and I look forward to seeing them confirmed soon. Please keep them in your prayers.

Last Saturday evening I had the pleasure of attending the Basketball Banquet with a lot of our young basketball players and their families. It was nice to note their accomplishments and celebrate their season. I want to thank all the players, coaches, and parents for such a nice season and dinner.

As we begin Holy Week, I want to encourage everyone to make a real effort to come to Church on both Holy Thursday (7 PM) and Good Friday (3 PM). Our church really should be filled on those most holy days. They are the days on which Jesus gave us His greatest gift – His Body and Blood, offered on the Cross to take away our sins so we can have eternal life in Heaven! Our presence in church on Holy Thursday and Good Friday are a token of our appreciation of all that He did.

Following the 7 PM Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, our Church will remain open for prayer and adoration until 11 PM. This is intended to allow us to accept Jesus' invitation to 'come and spend some time' with Him. He said this to the Apostles on that first Holy Thursday, and although they fell asleep on Him a few times, they accepted the invitation and spent that time with our Lord. We do well to follow their example – except, perhaps, the part about falling asleep – and spend some time with our Lord in Church on Holy Thursday evening.

Please remember that Mass on Holy Saturday is at 7 PM – rather than the usual 5 PM. This is due to the Catholic Church's ancient tradition of offering Holy Mass after dusk on Holy Saturday. Doing this makes that Mass a true vigil for the Resurrection. While that Easter Vigil Mass is a bit longer than an ordinary Mass, it is also very beautiful, inspiring, and well worth attending. (I promise to move it along as prayerfully and reverently as I can!)

I really want to thank all of you for making this Lent such a good one in our parish. It was great to see so many people at our parish mission on Tuesday evenings. Stations of the Cross and Daily Mass were well attended, and a good number of people went to Confession. Many people took Rice Bowls, which can be returned to the basket in the back of the Church over the next few weeks. I'm sure God will bless our observance of Lent with a renewal of our faith in Him and His Son, Jesus Christ.

I also want to acknowledge everyone who took and read the book on St. John Vianney. Several of you mentioned that you enjoyed the book, and it has been an inspiration to you. Hearing the insights and thoughts about St. John Vianney from those who attended the book study has been very rewarding for me. A special thank you to each and every one of you.






