

Pastor's Column: September 16 - 17, 2023

Last Thursday evening I had the pleasure of attending the Pride in Priests Dinner sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. All our parish priests were there, as was our bishop and many priests from around the diocese. We even saw Fr. Bede, who came with the Knights from his new parishes.

Honoring priests by means of this dinner is only one of the many good works of the Knights of Columbus. They do a great deal of Charity, raising money for food pantries and shelters. They're also very active promoting each and every person's right to life – especially by supporting places like Life Choices that help mothers in all kinds of ways.

In doing such things the Knights of Columbus are following the good example of their saintly founder, Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney. He was a parish priest in Connecticut who founded the Knights in the 1800's to provide support and fraternity for Catholic men who wanted to live their faith. Remember that many Catholic men at that time were immigrants who only got the most dangerous and low paying jobs, and that anti – Catholic sentiment was rampant. The fraternity and mutual support provided by the Knights of Columbus helped these men keep the faith and raise their families.

I encourage every Catholic man in our parish to consider joining this wonderful group! Doing so is a great way to meet other Catholic men, grow in your faith, and do those good works that are essential to the Christian life.

This weekend is Catechetical Sunday. It is a day to remember that we are all called to 'catechize' – or teach – the Faith to others. For this reason, we will have a special blessing for all our CCD and School teachers at the 10 AM Mass today.

As we ask God's blessing on those who teach the faith, we do well to remember that parents are always the primary religious educators of their children. When God blesses a couple with a child, he also gives them the mission of sharing their faith in Jesus Christ with that child. Teaching children to pray, taking them to Church, sharing age -appropriate Bible stories with them are all ways that parents – indeed the whole family – does this.

Speaking about taking children to Church – I love to see, and hear children in Church. Some people tell me they worry that their little children will make too much noise and distract others at Mass. My advice to them is – don't worry about it. Personally – I like hearing children at Church. We belong to a Church that has always taught that children are a great blessing from God – and that parents should be open to welcoming each and every child God sends them. Hearing children in Church brings that Truth alive for me.

In the spirit of Catechetical Sunday, please remember to make sure that any school aged family member (grade 1-8), are enrolled in our CCD program or parish school. The lessons they learn in CCD or Religion class in school reinforce and build upon the things their family is teaching them about the Lord Jesus and the Catholic Faith He gave us. If you have any questions, or are not sure how to register, give me a call and I'll help you.

Finally, please keep praying that Hail Mary for me each day. Many of you have told me you are doing this, and I really appreciate it. God pours out many blessing to us in answer to our prayers for each other. Let's also pray for the sick, and for peace.

Thank you to all the parents and Catechists who made arrangements to attend the Parent Meeting on Monday.






