Saint of the Week: St. Teresa of Jesus







Pastor's Column October 7 - 8, 2023

October is the Month of the Holy Rosary. I placed some pamphlets about the Rosary in our Church. Please feel free to take one, especially if you're not sure how to pray it. Remember that we pray the Rosary together in Church at 4:30 PM every Saturday, prior to the 5 PM Mass. Joining in is a great way to learn to pray the Rosary if you don't already know how to do so.

Pope Saint Paul VI called the Rosary a 'compendium of the Gospel.' He said this because the Mysteries of the Rosary give us an overview of the Gospel story. Meditating on these mysteries allows us to spend some time thinking about the life of Christ and His Blessed Mother every day. That's one of the reasons so many saints have recommended that we pray the Rosary daily.

While I am certainly not a saint, I add my voice to theirs in recommending that you pray the Rosary daily. My personal experience has been that praying the Rosary ensures that – on even the busiest and craziest day – I find some quiet time with our Lord. Moreover, I find that when I pray the Rosary, the many people who have asked for my prayers come to mind. I thus use my daily Rosary as a time to pray for all of you and all the special intentions for which you have asked me to pray. I hope you will do the same for me – and for all those who are suffering in our community and around the world.

The Rosary is also the traditional prayer for peace. We all do well to pray not only for peace on earth – something desperately needed – but also peace within families and communities. Over the course of my life, I have found great peace in praying the Rosary, and I suspect that you will, too.

Please remember to fill out your All Souls envelopes soon if you have not already done so. Write on them the names of all those deceased family and friends you want us to pray for during November – the Month of All Souls. We will keep those envelopes near the Altar that month, and include the souls listed on them in all the Masses offered. Moreover, a Novena of Masses will be offered beginning on All Souls Day for the holy souls. Offerings are optional, of course.

This week the priests of our diocese will attend the annual convocation – or gathering – with our bishop. This annual gathering is a time for things like continuing education, priestly fraternity, and prayer. All of the priests in our parish will attend from Tuesday afternoon until Thursday. For this reason, there is no 7 AM Mass on Wednesday and Thursday this week – and one of our deacons will conduct a Communion Service in place of the 8:30 AM Mass those days. We will back to our normal Daily Mass schedule on Friday.

Please say a prayer for me – at least a Hail Mary a day – and be assured of my prayers for you. Please also pray for our bishop and all the priests of the diocese during the convocation. May this gathering be a time of spiritual renewal for all of our priests.

This movie tells the life story of John XXIII from his youth through his young priesthood, episcopacy, life as cardinal, and eventually his life as pope. Elected supposedly as an "interim Pope" who would just keep the status quo and listen to the advisers around him, John XXIII proved to be his own man when he surprised the Church and world by calling for the Second Vatican Council.
