

Pastor's Column October 21 – 22, 2023

Last Sunday I kind of felt like a ping pong ball. I drove out to Fr. Bede's new parish in Baptistown for his installation as pastor. Then I drove home to catch the end of the parish breakfast and offer the 12 Noon Mass.

Fr. Bede's installation was beautiful. Our bishop celebrated the Mass, with me and Fr. John Gloss concelebrating. Of course, Fr. Bede also concelebrated the Holy Mass. After Mass they had a little breakfast and coffee set up to celebrate. I was happy to be there, and to see some of our parishioners who likewise made the trip.

Remember that Election Day is coming on November 7th. We are blessed to have the right to vote as Americans and choose those who make the laws of our land. As Catholics, we have a moral obligation to vote, and to do so intelligently – guided by a well-formed conscience.

For Catholics, a well – formed conscience is one that it formed according to the Gospel and the teachings of the Church. This does not mean that the Church tells for whom should vote or even recommend certain candidates. Rather, the Church gives us moral principles that should guide our choices on election day.

Among these are the dignity of the human person and concurrent right to life. With abortion legal through all nine months of pregnancy in New Jersey, it is hard to see how we are respecting this most basic of all rights. Our state even permits minors to have abortions without any parental involvement.

You can learn how your representatives vote on such issues quite easily. Voting Records NJ Legislature, which I found online, tells you a lot of information about how your representatives vote on every bill that comes up. It is a good way to keep informed as you prepare to vote.

Last week I told you that I would tell you more about All Souls Day and praying for the dead. I'm going to start with the story of St. Monica, a woman of great faith who lived in the 300's. During her final illness, her sons asked if she wanted them to send her body back to her native land for burial. Her answer to them was classic: "Bury this old body anywhere. Don't trouble yourself over it. I simply ask you to remember me at the Lord's Altar wherever you are."

St. Monica knew that her sons' prayers would help her get to Heaven (2 Macc. 12:46). She knew that this is especially true of the prayers offered at the Altar – the Holy Mass – which is the most powerful prayer we have. That's why she wanted her sons to have that prayer offered for her when she passed from this life.

It is for this reason that we have a Funeral Mass when a loved one dies. The Funeral Mass is our first and foremost way of remembering those who've died at the Altar of the Lord. While some families today omit the Funeral Mass – and replace it with a simple Funeral Home Service – this should be done only when absolutely necessary.

Our All Souls envelopes are another way of remembering our deceased loved ones at the Altar of the Lord. We write on those envelopes the names of loved ones who have died. The envelopes are then placed near the Altar on All Souls Day (a day the Church sets aside specifically to pray for her dead members) and throughout the month of November (a month dedicated to praying for the souls of our departed brothers and sisters). In this way our deceased loved ones are included in all the Masses offered that month – especially those of the All Souls Novena. While it is customary to put an offering in these envelopes – that is strictly optional. Any offerings made are used to support the priests who say the Masses for our deceased loved ones.

Yet another way to remember our beloved dead at the Altar is to have Masses said for them. Many people have Mass said on the anniversary of a loved one's death – or their birthday or some other significant day. I personally have Mass offered for each of the deceased pastors of our parish on their anniversaries, and for all the priests who ever served here on both Holy Thursday and the Feast of St. John Vianney (the patron saint of priests). You can do this by contacting the parish office – who will be happy to schedule a Mass for you so long as there is one available on that date (weekends fill up very quickly!). While there is a usual offering of \$10, it is actually voluntary – as with the All Souls Envelopes.

The main point is this: our prayers help our loved ones pass quickly through purgatory and into Heaven. I have placed pamphlets purgatory and praying for the dead on the book rack in the Church lobby. Feel free to take one home, read it, and pass it along to your family.

I want to thank everyone who joined in the Rosary for peace last Tuesday. Please continue to pray for peace, especially in the Holy Land and Ukraine. Pray also that people will come to respect each person's right to life, and for an end to acts of terror and violence.

Please also pray a Hail Mary for me today – and every day.


