Saint of the Week: St. Martin de Porres




St. Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru to a Spanish knight and freed slave of Panama. He, along with his mother and sister, were seen and treated as outcasts in their society. At the age of 12 he began apprenticing to a barber and medical technician. Later, St. Martin applied to the Dominican order as a lay helper

instead of a Brother, as he often felt unworthy throughout his life due to the way society had treated him. He became very well known for his dedication to God and constant work to help the poor, ill and misunderstood people and animals of his community. St. Martin is known for many selfless acts including founding an orphanage, providing a home for freed slaves, and performing healing miracles, to name a few. St. Martin is known as the patron saint of African Americans, Race Relations and Social Justice. May we learn from St. Martin de Porres to speak out for God in a society that has difficulty dealing with race, poverty and helping those who have been cast out.

Pastor's Column October 28 – 29, 2023

One common way to think about the Church is as a big spiritual family. God is our Father, and in Baptism we become his adopted children – and brothers and sisters to each other. This week we celebrate, with Catholics around the world, two holy days that help us think about the whole family of God.

November 1st is All Saints Day – a day to honor all the saints in heaven. I like to think of the saints as our older brothers and sisters in God's family. We all know that you can learn a lot from watching and listening to your older brothers and sisters. That is especially true of our relationship with the saints. Their example and words teach us how to be good members of God's family – just as they were when they walked this earth. Moreover, just as a good older brother or sister is always happy to help us, so the saints help us with their prayers before God's throne.

We call this part of God's family the Church Triumphant. Saint Paul often compared the Christian life to a race or sporting event – and urged everyone to 'run so as to win.' The saints did that by leading holy lives on earth. They have 'won the race' and now live with God in Heaven.

All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation. This means that every Catholic who is able to do so has a serious obligation to attend Mass that day. Accordingly, Masses for All Saints Day will be offered in our Church Tuesday evening at 7 PM and on Wednesday at 7, 8:30, and 9:30 AM and 7 PM. I look forward to praying and honoring the saints with many of you at Mass that day.

Thursday, November 2nd, is All Souls Day. It is a day to pray for another part of God's family: the souls in purgatory – who are on their way to Heaven. While not a holy day of obligation per se, many people like to attend Mass that day to pray for their loved ones who have died. Indeed, these souls are also our brothers and sisters in God's family, and we do well to assist them with our prayers.

We call this part of God's family the Church Suffering. They know they are on their way to Heaven – and are longing to be there. Our prayers can help them join the triumphant saints in Heaven.

Holy Mass will be offered in our Church on All Souls Day at 7 and 8:30 AM, and 7 PM. The Mass at 7 PM will be offered especially for members of our parish who died this past year. Everyone is welcome to join us in praying at this beautiful Holy Mass. Inserted in this week's bulletin is an article about Purgatory and praying for the dead. I would encourage everyone to read it in order to gain a deeper understanding of this beautiful part of our Catholic Faith.

Last Saturday I had a great time with about 40 of our parish 8th graders at their Confirmation Retreat. Fr. Greg, Deacon Tom, and some CCD teachers were also there and we kind of gave the retreat together. These forty people represent about half of those who are preparing for Confirmation in our parish this year. The rest will make their retreat next week. Please pray for them as they prepare to be strengthened by the Holy Spirit in Confirmation.

This weekend we are visited by Gifts From Bethlehem. The inspiring sacred art they bring is made from olive wood from the Holy Land. It is one of the only sources of income for much of the Christian population living in the Holy Land today. The Christian population of the Holy Land has suffered much over the centuries, to the point where they are less than 2 % - down from 25 % in 1922. Please keep them in your prayers – and support them if you can.

I will not be at today's noon Mass, because I will attend the installation of the new pastor of my home parish in South Amboy. He was kind enough to invite me, and I am happy to attend. Please pray for him as he takes on this pastoral responsibility. Next Sunday, our bishop will be here for the 12 Noon Mass at our Church.

Bishop Checchio likes to visit and offer Mass in the various Churches of the diocese, and we are please he will visit us next week. If you can come to that Mass and pray with our bishop, that would be great. It is always good to join our bishop at Holy Mass.

Please remember to pray for me – at least one Hail Mary a day. I pray daily for you! Please also remember to pray for the sick, and all souls of our brothers and sisters in Purgatory. Finally, keep praying for peace in the Holy Land, the Ukraine, and around the world.


