Saint of the Week: The Solemnity of Christ the King





Pastor's Column November 18 - 19, 2023

Can you believe that Thanksgiving is this Thursday? Time really does fly these days.

Thanksgiving is a good time for us to take stock of the blessings God has given us – and be sure to thank Him. This, of course, is something we should do in our prayers each and every day. We should also remember that we thank God by remembering those who may not enjoy all the blessings that we do and practicing Christian Charity towards them.

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has decreed that the 33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time (which is today!) be observed as a Day of Prayer for the Poor. His intention is that we should both pray and find concrete ways to assist the poor of our community and the world. So many of you do this so well, especially through your recent support of the Adopt a Turkey Campaign.

Our Saint Vincent de Paul Society always seems to have a way for us to help the poor underway. The Giving Tree will appear soon, as we prepare for Christmas. One of the things for which I am certainly thankful this Thanksgiving is the charity of so many of our parishioners to the poor.

Remember that we will have a special Mass for Increased Respect for Human Life in Church today at 5 PM. There is most definitely a connection between respect for human life and care for the poor. Both are rooted in the God given dignity of every human life, and our Christian responsibility to care for all people, rich and poor, born and unborn.

Remember that Holy Mass will be offered on Thanksgiving Day at 7 and 8:30 AM. While not a Holy Day of Obligation, Thanksgiving is a good day to get to Mass if you can. Doing so is a good way to remember the spiritual roots of this wonderful holiday.

After Mass here in the morning, I will spend Thanksgiving Day with my family. We will gather at my sister Natalie's home. I'm sure we will have a great meal, lots of fun, and a good time together. I hope many of you have a chance to spend time with loved ones on Thanksgiving Day.

As I mentioned at all the Masses last week, we are conducting a Feasibility Study regarding a Comprehensive Capital Campaign. Many of you have received surveys in the mail, and some will be contacted personally for your thoughts. As I said at Mass, it is important to offer honest feedback. This is essential to deciding as a parish family about the many needs we are facing.

I want to thank all of you who have spoken with me already about the coming campaign. One question was about the status of our parish debt to the diocese. Just to give some basic information, we pay about \$11,800 a month on our debt – which comes to about \$141,000 a year.

That said, we are planning to put more frequent updates about our debt and repayment of it in the bulletin. It will begin appearing in a week or so in the section that reports the collection. My hope is that, among other things, our campaign will help us to make needed repairs to our parish plant without adding to that debt. God will, we can raise enough to not only make the repairs we must, but also pay down our debt more aggressively.

Keep watching this space for more details as the feasibility study continues. And, in your kindness, keep praying that daily Hail Mary for me. Let's also be sure to pray for peace – in the Holy Land, Ukraine, and in every human heart.

Parish Advisory Council

This council is a group of dedicated parishioners who meet with the pastor several times a year. The purpose of the group is to provide a forum for communication between various groups in the parish, to discuss issues or questions proposed by the pastor or brought to him or members of the group by parishioners.

While the council has met irregularly for some time, we will now meet on a regular basis. At our November 8th meeting we set a schedule to meet five times a year - generally every other month with a break in the summer.


