"Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" LUKE 1:28

After Jesus, we look to Mary as an ideal steward. Her entire life was lived in obedience to God's call. Mary teaches us to live with joy for all we have been given. Just as the moon reflects the light of the sun, Mary reflects the light of Christ. Like Mary, we are called to reflect Christ's light to the world through our gratitude and generosity.

Reflection

This fourth Sunday of Advent, we light the fourth candle on the Advent Wreath. The last purple candle is the Angel's candle and symbolizes Peace. As we enter this fourth week of Advent, we begin our final preparations for Christ's coming on Christmas day. One of the most important things we must do these last few days of Advent is to ask ourselves, 'What do I truly believe?' The Christmas season is filled with so much hope, love, jov. and peace but also the craziness of shopping, baking, planning, decorating – it's so easy to lose sight of the true meaning of why we are celebrating in the first place. Especially during the chaos that can come with Christmas, time seems to fly by, and you are probably finding yourself searching for some peace and guiet. I encourage you to take time out of your busy schedule to look, listen and ponder the fact that Jesus, our one true Messiah, is the foundation for this celebration. When we light each candle on the Advent wreath, we are acknowledging that Christ is the light that enables us to share and celebrate the love and compassion of God. Although things can get overwhelming this time of year, it is so important to slow down, lean on Christ and share

in the true meaning of this Christmas season. The Messiah is near, He is only a few days away. These last few days of Advent I encourage you to use the gifts God has blessed you with to share the light and peace of God with others.

Pastor's Column December 23 – 24, 2023

I want to begin my words this week by wishing each of every one of you a very merry and blessed Christmas. The birth of our Savior reminds us of just how much God loves the world – and every person in it. The Good News of Christmas is that God loves the world so much that He was willing to come down from Heaven and be born into our human family. In the person of Jesus Christ, God the Son came from Heaven to earth, so that He could lead us from earth to Heaven. That is what we celebrate during this most joyful season – with all of our lights and decorations and family Christmas traditions.

Over the years my celebration of Christmas has changed in some ways – and stayed the same in others. As a child, I used to wake my younger sisters early in the morning, before dawn. We would race to see what Santa had brought and were never disappointed. My exhausted parents, who probably hadn't been in bed very long, would come down to join us as we opened presents and played with new toys.

Today my Christmas is filled with celebrations of Holy Mass. This is my 37th Christmas as a priest, and I am still awed to offer Holy Mass – especially on days like Christmas. It's a gift I wouldn't trade for all the world. My excitement these days comes from seeing all of you at Holy Mass, and from praying and celebrating with you. The Solemn Mass at Midnight has become the very center of my Christmas celebration!

After all the Masses are over on Christmas Day, I visit my family. That's one thing that hasn't' changed! Instead of visiting grandparents, I usually wind up at the home of my sister Christine on Christmas. My mom is always there, enjoying her family the way her parents enjoyed their family years ago. After a wonderful meal I will head back to rectory, filled with the joy of another Christmas.

I hope your Christmas is filled with family, friends, and the joy that Christ's birth once brought to Mary, Joseph, and the Shepherds! Let's pray for each other on Christmas and always!

The schedule for Masses on Christmas Eve and Day is elsewhere in this bulletin. Please be sure to attend Holy Mass for Christmas – as well as for this Sunday! The extra Mass we attend this weekend will be a great source of grace to us, and a witness to our love for Jesus!

Remember that we will have a Holy Hour on New Year's Eve, from 11 PM – midnight. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for prayer, and priests will hear Confessions for anyone who wishes to go. Most of all, we will thank God for the blessings of the old year and ask His continued grace and blessing upon us in the year to come.

Please remember to pray that Hail Mary for me each day – and be assured of my prayers for you. Let's also pray for peace, and for the sick and all in need. May the joy of Christ's birth give hope to all those who are suffering in any way – and may the generosity of God, Who gave us His own Son on that very first Christmas, inspire us to be generous to all.

Update from the Religious Education Program

A few things about Christmas...

First, when you come to Mass this weekend (December 23/24) the church will be decorated for Christmas – BUT it is not Christmas! It is still Advent. With Christmas on Monday, the only day to decorate for Christmas was Friday.

The Advent wreath in the front near the Baptismal font, the purple altar cloth and purple vestments the priest wears, remind us that we are still in Advent. We celebrate the 4th Sunday of Advent this weekend.

Christmas is too big for one day- Christmas is a whole season that begins with the vigil Mass on December 24th and continues until the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus on January 8th. During this time, we celebrate some special feasts:

☐ The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph;
☐ The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God;
☐ The Epiphany of the Lord; and


