Saint of the Week: St. Hilary




St. Hilary grew up in Gaul, which is part of modern-day France. He was a convert to Christianity as an adult and wound up eventually becoming bishop of Poitiers, France. Throughout his time as bishop, he went to great lengths to

defend Christianity against Arianism. He fought against this until his death. St. Hilary was exiled by the Arians, but wound up being sent back home, and was welcomed by his people. Pastor's Column January 6 – 7, 2024

Today we celebrate the Solemn Feast of Epiphany. The word epiphany means 'to reveal or make know something that was hidden.' The star revealed to the Magi that the child in the manger – who looked like any ordinary baby – was the King of Kings and Savior of the World. That's why we call today 'Epiphany.'

For centuries Epiphany was the end of the Christmas Season, but the reforms following the Second Vatican Council in the 1960's extended it to the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. While usually celebrated on the Sunday after Epiphany, the Lord's Baptism will be celebrated this year on Monday, January 8th, bringing the joyful Christmas Season to a close.

Personally, I hate to see the Christmas Season end. It is my favorite of all the Church's seasons. It's not too long and has a very joyful tenor to it. I enjoy the Gospel stories surrounding Christ's birth and childhood, the colorful decorations in the Church, and the upbeat spirit of the Christmas season – and will look forward to next year's as soon as this year's ends!

I was so happy to see so many people at Church for Christmas and Christmas Eve. Seeing so many of you at Mass twice – for both the Fourth Sunday of Advent and for Christmas – was truly inspiring! Coming to Mass twice in a few days is a great witness to your faith. I commend each and every one of you who did so.

I want to make special mention of the people who attended the Holy Hour on New Year's Eve from 11 PM to midnight. A few dozen people – which is a lot more than last year – came to pray and adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament as the old year ended and the new one began. It was a great way to begin what I pray will be a new year of grace and blessing our parish and each one of us.

Remember that we are still observing the Year of Eucharistic Revival. We have been asked by both our Holy Father, Pope Francis, and the bishops of our country to make a special effort to celebrate, learn about, and deepen our faith in Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist this year. A good way to do this is the upcoming seven-part series Jesus and the Eucharist. More information can be found in the bulletin, near the Eucharistic Revival spot.

Another good way to grow in appreciation of the Real Presence is Eucharistic Adoration. We have this every Saturday morning from 8:30 – 9:30 AM. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed for prayer and adoration at that time. Come and adore Jesus – and allow Him to build up your faith in His Real Presence.

Saint John Vianney – the patron saint of our parish – had a very intense faith in Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist. In his homilies, he would often point to the Tabernacle, where the Eucharist consecrated at previous Masses is kept, and say "it's Him, it's Him." St. John wanted to make sure that all of his parishioners knew that Jesus is really present in the Eucharist, even though it appears as bread and wine. May we, the people of this parish entrusted to his patronage and prayers, always be mindful of that Truth!

Please pray for me – at least one Hail Mary a day. Prayer is one of the greatest things we can do for each other – and I appreciate that so many of you do it for me. You are all in my daily prayers.

CELEBRATE WITH A KING CAKE!



King Cake season goes from the Feast of the Epiphany through Shrove Tuesday (Mardi Gras). This round "crown" cake, represents the journey of the 3 kings, and is decorated in purple (justice), green (faith) and gold (power) icing or sugar. Some cakes have a hidden bean or tiny plastic baby hidden inside and the one who finds it is "crowned", or responsible for the next cake.

Ingredients

1 cup milk (scalded) 1/3 cup butter (melted in milk)

small bowl

1/4 cup warm water 1 package yeast 1 tsp. sugar

small bowl

2 eggs beaten 1/2 cup sugar pinch salt

small bowl

Let all ingredients sit about 15 minutes, add to flour - mix well

4 cups flour

large bowl

Directions



Knead on floured surface, 10 minutes (add more flour if needed). Rub dough ball with vegetable oil and place in covered oiled bowl in warm place to rise, 1 hour or double in size. Roll flat into rectangle and brush on oil or melted butter, sprinkle with sugar cinnamon. Roll into log starting on long edge. Form into ring (crown), pinch edges together and let rise on baking tray. Bake 350° for 15 - 20 minutes or until golden brown.

Colored sugar: In a jar add 1/2 cup sugar, 1-2 drops food color... green or yellow or red/blue (purple) and shake well. Decorate with green, purple & yellow (gold) cake icing and colored sugar. This cake does not include a bean or baby, as in some traditions, due to choking hazard.
