February 4, 2024 Presentation of the Lord

"Rising very early before dawn, He left and went off to a deserted place, where He prayed...He told them, 'Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this page 1 come."

- MARK 1:35, 38

In today's Gospel reading we see a perfect example of stewardship. Jesus gives His time to do all that God wishes – healing the sick and preaching. But before He begins, Jesus takes time to be alone with God in prayer. It is through prayer, spending time with God, that we are given the graces needed to do what He wishes us to do. Praying before acting is a great habit to develop.

Hello St. John Vianney Parish community!

Today's Gospel reading from Mark 1:29-39 is one of my favorite Bible stories. I can read this passage multiple times over and still come out with a different insight each time. Here. Jesus heals Simon's mother-in-law and others. She was sick with an intense fever that would not break. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her to sit up. Immediately, the fever left her, and she waited on them. After this, once the sun had set and evening had arrived, the disciples brought to Him all who were ill or possessed by demons. Soon, the entire town was gathered at the door. He cured those who were sick with various diseases. He drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew Him. The next morning, Jesus rose very early before dawn and went off alone to pray in a deserted place. Simon and the others pursued Him. Upon finding Jesus, they said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose, have I come." Thus, Christ went into their synagogues, preaching and exorcising demons throughout the whole of Galilee.

As I reflect on this story today, I'm going to focus on three things that Jesus did: He always prayed before engaging with and performing his vital ministry; He was always moving onto the next location to advance and further his saving ministry; He was always concerned about and looking after His peoples' needs. Christ showed that he genuinely cared. My dear parishioners, here are my questions for you: Shouldn't you be trying to do the same three things as a follower of Jesus? He may be calling on you now to help a neighbor in need. Do you have time for those in need? Please take a few moments to rest in the heart of Jesus and reflect on these questions.

My last request is to encourage the high school students and young people of our church to join our parish youth group. Information is available on the parish website, the youth group's facebook page, and in-person and by phone at the parish office. February 9th there will be a Youth Group Holy Hour in Church from 7-8:30pm.



Pastor's Column: February 3 - 4, 2024

This Saturday our parish was blessed to have about 65 children celebrate the Sacrament of Penance for the first time. I want to congratulate each of them on this milestone in their journey of faith. May it be the first of many experiences of God's loving mercy for them.

I also want to thank their teachers – both in our parish school and CCD program – for helping these great children prepare for their First Confession. Thanks also to their parents, who first planted the seed of faith in them. Please pray for these children and their families as they continue to get ready for First Holy Communion this spring.

That same day, one of our high school parishioners was being honored by our Bishop at St. Francis Cathedral. Evan Chin, whom many of you know and most of you would recognize if you saw him, received the Saint Timothy Award from Bishop Checchio. The Saint Timothy Award is given to a high school senior or junior who not only lives his or her faith, but also leads others in doing so.

If there is such a thing as the perfect candidate for this award, it is our Evan Chin. Many of you know him from playing the guitar and singing with the Youth Choir at Mass. He also serves Mass – extremely well – and has taught others how to do so. I am personally thankful to Evan for his willingness to assist younger servers and serve things like the Solemn Mass at midnight on Christmas. He handles incense better than me!

Evan's faith and leadership has been recognized by his high school as well. He serves as an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist at the Masses at St. Joe's High School and has led retreats for other students. For all these reasons, he is a deserving recipient of the St. Timothy Award.

Writing about Evan and our first penitents reminds me how blessed our parish is to have so many wonderful young people. Another example is the growing Youth Ministry program under Sr. Luciana's inspired leadership.
