Pastor's Column: July 26 – July 27, 2025

This week we are pleased to welcome Fr. Gregory Ramon-Gaston to our parish. He is here to make the annual Mission Co-op Appeal. As mentioned in previous bulletins, Fr. Gregory is the Rector – or priest in charge – of the Filipino Seminary in Rome. As such he is responsible for training priests to serve in the Philippines. I'm sure he will explain his mission in his talks at Mass.

Remember that the Mission Co-op Appeal is different from World Mission Sunday. World Mission Sunday happens in October and supports the missionary efforts of the universal Church. The Mission Co-op Appeal, which will happen in our parish this week, supports a specific missionary effort. A speaker, usually a missionary connected with that mission, visits the parish and speaks about that mission.

Our parish has a history of generously supporting the missions. Thanks for that, and thanks in advance for supporting this one and for making Fr. Gregory welcome in our parish.

Next Sunday, August 4th, is the Feast of St. John Vianney. Since he is our patron saint, his feast is a solemnity in our parish. This means that the prayers and reading for Holy Mass next Saturday evening and Sunday will be different from those in the missalette. To help you participate in Mass those days, we will print a 'worship aid' – a little folded paper with the proper readings for that day.

We will also have the relic of St. John Vianney on a table near the Altar – along with a statue of him. I will ask the priests to bless the assembly after each Mass with the relic. People may also venerate St. John's relics after each Mass next week.

Our parish is truly blessed to have Saint John Vianney as her patron saint. Many people think a patron saint is simply one for whom our parish is named. But being a patron saint entails much more than that.

As our patron saint, Saint John Vianney takes on special responsibility for our parish and her members. He prays for us individually – and for our parish collectively – before God's throne in Heaven. Because we have been placed under his patronage, St. John Vianney takes a special interest in helping us follow Jesus and get to Heaven one day.

In addition to his prayers for us, Saint John Vianney also helps us by his example. Indeed, we do well to follow the example of this saintly priest in our own lives. While I will give you a more detailed biography of him in my column next week, I will give you a few ways to follow his example now.

The first is to pray. St. John Vianney spent hours in prayer each day. While that may be impractical for some of you with work and family, you do well to make sure to pray each day. I would suggest that, at the very least, do your best to pray the Rosary every day.

The second is to be devoted to the Mass and the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Pay attention while at Mass. Follow the readings and prayers. Sing the chants and songs. Most of all, enter prayerfully into every Mass you attend.

The third is to be good to the poor. Saint John Vianney was extremely good to the poor – to the point where he had just about nothing for himself. While you certainly need to be prudent about your needs and those of your family, bringing food for the pantry and supporting the many things our parish does for the poor – as many of you do – is a good way to follow his example.

Please remember to keep me in your prayers, at least one Hail Mary a day. God is so good in hearing our prayers and pouring His blessings upon us in answer to our prayers for each other. Let's also pray for Fr. Gregory and all the missionaries around the world. Be assured of my constant prayers for each of you, and for our parish.

Dear Parish Family and Beloved Parents of Our Youth Group,

This week, I've been sitting with the words of Jesus in Luke 11, where He teaches the Lord's Prayer. What strikes me most isn't just the prayer itself, but the way Jesus invites us to come to God like children — honestly, persistently, and without fear. It reminds me that prayer isn't about getting the words right; it's about relationship. It's about turning to our Father with whatever we're carrying, trusting that He hears us and that He cares deeply.

To our young people: I want you to know that prayer isn't something you have to figure out or perfect. It's just talking to God — even when you don't know what to say. Some of the most powerful prayers are the simplest ones: "God, I'm tired," "Help me," or even just sitting in silence with Him. You don't have to have it all together. Just show up. God sees you. Keep showing up. Keep knocking. He's not annoyed — He's waiting with love and open arms.

To our parish community: I believe with all my heart that our young people need to see us living out this kind of prayerful trust. They need to know they belong to a church family that supports them, listens to them, and walks beside them in faith. Let's be a people who pray with courage, who believe that God is good even when the answers come slowly, and who help the next generation discover just how close and kind our Father truly is.




