

Pastor's Column: August 2 - August 3, 2025

I want to thank everyone who supported last week's Mission Co-op Appeal. It was a pleasure to meet Fr. Gregory Gaston, the speaker. Through conversations with him I learned a lot about his work in Rome with priests serving in the Philippines. I am happy our parish had the opportunity to support this work.

Last Saturday I had the pleasure of spending most of the day at the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima in Washington, NJ. Often called the Blue Army Shrine – after the group that first established it – the Shrine is a beautiful place of prayer nestled in the hills of northwestern New Jersey. The reason for my visit was Legion of Mary Day.

Many people – both members of the Legion of Mary and others – gathered for a day of prayer, talks, and adoration. Many confessions were heard, making for a grace filled day. It was especially nice to see some people from our parish there.

I want to thank the members of the Legion of Mary for organizing the day. Our parish has been blessed to have a Legion of Mary praesidium – or local group – for a couple of years now. I am impressed by their dedication and encourage anyone looking for a serious spiritual group to speak with them and consider joining them.

This weekend our parish celebrates the Feast of St. John Vianney – our patron saint. His relics are near the Altar today and can be venerated after and between Masses. We can also gain a special indulgence today under the 'usual conditions' – receive Holy Communion worthily, go to Confession, and say a prayer for the pope within 20 days. If we are completely detached from all sin, including venial sin, the indulgence can be plenary. Otherwise, it is partial. There is a nice plaque in the narthex of the Church explaining this.

Last year, we distributed holy cards with a picture of St. John Vianney on one side and quotes from some of his homilies on the other. This year we have holy cards with Saint Philomena on them for people to take. Saint Philomena was one of Saint John Vianney's favorite saints. He often prayed for her intercession.

Saint Philomena was a young woman who was born around the year 291. Her father had converted from paganism to Catholicism and shared his faith with Philomena. During the reign of Diocletian, a Roman emperor who oversaw one of the last – and most brutal – persecutions of the Church, she died as a martyr.

Moved by her love for Jesus, Philomena made a vow of virginity. She lived a life of prayer and good works – as did other Virgin Martyrs of that time such as St. Lucy and St. Cecilia. The willingness of these young women to serve Christ in this way should be an example to all of us. The sacrifices they made for Him should remind us that nothing is too much for God!

Tomorrow (Monday) morning I am leaving for my vacation. God willing, I will drive out to North Platte, Nebraska to watch trains and relax. I'll also read a couple of books, pray, and enjoy much of the natural beauty of our country. My plan is to be home in time to celebrate the 7 PM Mass on August 15th – the Solemn Feast of the Assumption.

Be assured that I will pray for you, as I have a lot of time for prayer on this trip. Please pray for me, at least one Hail Mary a day. Let's also pray for the sick and for peace.

OCIA

Have you noticed OCIA in the bulletin and wondered, what is OCIA? OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. That tells you what the acronym means, but more important is what might OCIA mean for you or someone you know. By the way, until a couple of years ago, OCIA was RCIA. If you have heard of RCIA, OCIA is really the same process.

Were you baptized in a Catholic Church, but for whatever reason never received First Communion and Confirmation? Through OCIA you can prepare to receive both First Communion and Confirmation. Or you were Baptized and received First Communion but for some reason you missed Confirmation. OCIA can prepare you for Confirmation.

Were you baptized in another Christian tradition (a few examples are Methodist, Lutheran, Presbyterian), but you have come to Mass at a Catholic Church with your spouse or fiancé or a good friend who is Catholic? Or you came by yourself to check it out.

You were never baptized. You may have been raised in a non-Christian family or in a family where no religion was practiced. Have you been searching, not sure what you have been looking for?

A question I am often asked is whether the adult is too old. No! What is the best age to participate? The age when you have a desire, when you think what you have been searching for is in the Catholic Church.

Are you interested in inquiring about the Catholic Church and possibly becoming Catholic? OCIA is the process that gives adults the opportunity to learn what it means to be Catholic, and if an adult wishes to become Catholic, provides the means to be received into the Catholic Church. Call or email if you have questions or think you might like to participate in our group this year.

We will start meeting in late August. Based on the availability of the folks who have already expressed interest, it looks like we will meet on Sudays after the noon Mass. If you are away on vacation, not to worry, we can get you caught up.

An OCIA brochure is available in the entrance area of the Church. May God bless you as you explore whether the OCIA process is for you.




