Series- The Nicene Creed

Every Sunday we profess our faith as we pray the Nicene Creed. This year marks the 1,700th anniversary since the Council of Nicea during which the bishops who gathered proclaimed the central doctrines of the faith. The name Nicene comes from the location of the gathering in Nicea, in what is now northern Turkey.

Have you ever thought about the words we pray every Sunday? What are we actually saying we believe when we pray these 1,700-year-old words? And what do begotten and consubstantial mean anyway?

We will offer a six-week series to unpack the Nicene Creed. We will use Bishop Robert Barron's book, *What Christians Believe Understanding the Nicene Creed*, excerpts from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (Part One is dedicated to the Profession of Faith), selected sections from Bishop Barron's video presentations on the Creed and some other resources.

Pastor's Column August 30 - 31, 2025

This Monday is Labor Day – a day to honor all those who work for a living. As Catholics we believe that work is part of God's plan for us. St. Paul – in one of his letters – tells us to 'earn the food we eat by working quietly.' He also admonishes those 'who do not keep busy – but act like busybodies.' He even goes so far as to say that 'those who do not work should not eat.'

In this St. Paul is certainly not putting down those who cannot work due to age, disability, or circumstance. Neither is he, who constantly commands us to practice charity, discouraging us from helping those who truly are in need. But St. Paul is reminding us that work has a place in God's plan – and we do well to reflect prayerfully on the good we can do by working according to His will.

St. Joseph is our model in this. The different kinds of work he did are an example to each and every one of us. He worked as a carpenter to provide a home for Jesus and Mary – reminding us that working to support a family is pleasing in God's sight. He worked at being a faithful husband and loving foster father to Jesus – a vitally important kind of work that is all too often overlooked. Finally, St. Joseph worked at his own faith (remember how he and Mary brought Jesus to the Temple, and things like that?). On this Labor Day, let's look to the example of St. Joseph and follow it as best as we can.

After Labor Day comes the beginning of a new school year. It is hard for me to believe that the summer is over, and school is about to start again. The beginning of the school year is also the beginning of the Religious Education year. News about both our Parish School and CCD program can be found elsewhere in this bulletin. Please read it carefully.

There was a very nice article in the Catholic Spirit about Patrick Rasimowicz – the seminarian who spent last year in our parish. The article described the positive impact that Patrick had on our 8th grade students, whose religion class he taught last year. It was a nice read.

For those who may not know, the Catholic Spirit is our diocesan newspaper. It covers news about parishes and such in our diocese and has columns from several priests and Catholic columnists. A bunch of copies are sent to us each month, and I put them in the narthex for those who wish to read them. You can also find it on the Diocese of Metuchen website. It is well worth reading.

This weekend we are having a hastily arranged special collection to assist the Church in the Holy Land and Gaza. People living in that area have obviously been affected by the ongoing war. Churches have been damaged, and I am sure that schools and charitable institutions have been, too. Today's second collection will help Catholic Relief Services and Catholic Near East Welfare Association – agencies who do much good work in such situations – to provide much needed assistance.

Our next second collection will be the weekend of September 13 - 14. It will be the annual Peter's Pence – which supports the work of our Holy Father, Pope Leo. I will tell you more about the history and purpose of this collection next week.

After Mass and Baptisms last Sunday, I had dinner with my mother. We went to a diner she enjoys and had a good time. As always, it was good to spend time with her. I hope many of you take the opportunity to enjoy time with your family on Sundays. It is a great way to honor the Lord's Day, after going to Mass.

Please keep me in your prayers – at least one Hail Mary a day. Please also pray for the students and teachers returning to school and for peace. Have a great week.

OCIA

Have you noticed OCIA in the bulletin and wondered, what is OCIA? OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. That tells you what the acronym means, but more important is what might OCIA mean for you or someone you know. By the way, until a couple of years ago, OCIA was RCIA. If you have heard of RCIA, OCIA is really the same process.

Were you baptized in a Catholic Church, but for whatever reason never received First Communion and Confirmation? Through OCIA you can prepare to receive both First Communion and Confirmation. Or you were Baptized and received First Communion but for some reason you missed Confirmation. OCIA can prepare you for Confirmation.

Were you baptized in another Christian tradition (a few examples are Methodist, Lutheran, Presbyterian), but you have come to Mass at a Catholic Church with your spouse or fiancé or a good friend who is Catholic? Or you came by yourself to check it out.

You were never baptized. You may have been raised in a non-Christian family or in a family where no religion was practiced. Have you been searching, not sure what you have been looking for?

A question I am often asked is whether the adult is too old. No! What is the best age to participate? The age when you have a desire, when you think what you have been searching for is in the Catholic Church.

Are you interested in inquiring about the Catholic Church and possibly becoming Catholic? OCIA is the process that gives adults the opportunity to learn what it means to be Catholic, and if an adult wishes to become Catholic, provides the means to be received into the Catholic Church. Call or email if you have questions or think you might like to participate in our group this year.

We will start meeting in late August. Based on the availability of the folks who have already expressed interest, it looks like we will meet on Sudays after the noon Mass. If you are away on vacation, not to worry, we can get you caught up.

An OCIA brochure is available in the entrance area of the Church. May God bless you as you explore whether the OCIA process is for you.


