Series - The Nicene Creed

Every Sunday we profess our faith as we pray the Nicene Creed. This year marks the 1,700th anniversary since the Council of Nicea during which the bishops who gathered proclaimed the central doctrines of the faith. The name Nicene comes from the location of the gathering in Nicea, in what is now northern Turkey.

Have you ever thought about the words we pray every Sunday? What are we actually saying we believe when we pray these 1,700-year-old words? And what do begotten and consubstantial mean anyway?

We will offer a six-week series to unpack the Nicene Creed. We will use Bishop Robert Barron's book, *What Christians Believe Understanding the Nicene Creed*, excerpts from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (Part One is dedicated to the Profession of Faith), selected sections from Bishop Barron's video presentations on the Creed and some other resources.

Pastor's Column September 20 - 21, 2025

This weekend is Catechetical Sunday. It is a day to remember that we are all called to 'catechize' – or teach – the Faith to others. For this reason, we will have a special blessing for all our CCD and Catholic School teachers at the 10 AM Mass today.

As we ask God's blessing on those who teach the faith, we do well to remember that parents are always the primary religious educators of their children. When God blesses a couple with a child, he also gives them the mission of sharing their faith in Jesus Christ with that child. Teaching children to pray, taking them to Church, sharing age - appropriate Bible stories with them are all ways that parents – indeed the whole family – does this.

Speaking about taking children to Church – I love to see and hear children in Church. Some people tell me they worry that their little children will make too much noise and distract others at Mass. My advice to them is – don't worry about it. Personally – I like hearing children at Church. We belong to a Church that has always taught that children are a great blessing from God – and that parents should be open to welcoming every child God sends them. Hearing children in Church brings that Truth alive for me.

In the spirit of Catechetical Sunday, please remember to make sure that any school aged family member (grade 1 – 8), are enrolled in our CCD program or parish school. The lessons they learn in CCD or Religion class in school reinforce and build upon the things their family is teaching them about the Lord Jesus and the Catholic Faith He gave us. If you have any questions, or are not sure how to register, give me a call and I'll help you.

One of the Truths of our Faith is that every human person is created in the 'image and likeness of God' (Genesis 1:26ff). For this reason, every human being has a sacred, God given dignity that deserves respect and protection. Regardless of race, age, health, or any other factors – every human being possesses a God given human dignity.

Events in our country – and around the world – show how much we need to be reminded of this Truth. Ongoing wars with no end in sight, shootings of innocent people, and random acts of violence all reveal a gross disrespect for God's sacred gift of human life – as does the destruction of innocent human life in the womb.

With all this in mind, I want to mention two things. The first is that there will be a Mass and rally for life at St. Mary's Cathedral in Trenton this Thursday. Some of our parishioners are going – as are Fr. Greg and Fr. Jay. It will be a great opportunity to pray and call for an increased respect for human life. I encourage those who can do so to consider joining them – and all of us to join them in prayer.

The second is that I would like us to begin including a Prayer for Peace before each Mass on Sunday and Saturday evening. I will ask our Lectors to lead this prayer right after they make the announcements before the Entrance Chant at Mass. We will use the Prayer for Peace on the inside cover of the pew missals. Written by Pope Saint John Paul II, it is succinct and meaningful. My hope is that praying for peace will remind us of our call to be peacemakers – which, I believe, starts with respecting the God given dignity of every human person.

Speaking of prayer, I will be going to my seminary reunion in Emmitsburg, Maryland, from October 1-3. While there, I will visit and pray at the Shrine of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. I have spoken of my devotion to this great American Saint before. If you have people or intentions you would like me to include in prayer at Mother Seton's tomb, just write them on a piece of paper and give them to me before I leave. I will be happy to pray for you and any intentions you give me.

In the meantime, please keep praying that Hail Mary for me each day. Many of you have told me you are doing this, and I really appreciate it. God pours out many blessing to us in answer to our prayers for each other. Let's also pray for the sick and, of course, for peace.

OCIA

Have you noticed OCIA in the bulletin and wondered, what is OCIA? OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. That tells you what the acronym means, but more important is what might OCIA mean for you or someone you know. By the way, until a couple of years ago, OCIA was RCIA. If you have heard of RCIA, OCIA is really the same process.

Were you baptized in a Catholic Church, but for whatever reason never received First Communion and Confirmation? Through OCIA you can prepare to receive both First Communion and Confirmation. Or you were Baptized and received First Communion but for some reason you missed Confirmation. OCIA can prepare you for Confirmation.

Were you baptized in another Christian tradition (a few examples are Methodist, Lutheran, Presbyterian), but you have come to Mass at a Catholic Church with your spouse or fiancé or a good friend who is Catholic? Or you came by yourself to check it out.

You were never baptized. You may have been raised in a non-Christian family or in a family where no religion was practiced. Have you been searching, not sure what you have been looking for?

A question I am often asked is whether the adult is too old. No! What is the best age to participate? The age when you have a desire, when you think what you have been searching for is in the Catholic Church.

Are you interested in inquiring about the Catholic Church and possibly becoming Catholic? OCIA is the process that gives adults the opportunity to learn what it means to be Catholic, and if an adult wishes to become Catholic, provides the means to be received into the Catholic Church. Call or email if you have questions or think you might like to participate in our group this year.

We will start meeting in late August. Based on the availability of the folks who have already expressed interest, it looks like we will meet on Sudays after the noon Mass. If you are away on vacation, not to worry, we can get you caught up.

An OCIA brochure is available in the entrance area of the Church. May God bless you as you explore whether the OCIA process is for you.






