Pastor's Column March 1, 2026

As I write these words, the blizzard rages outside. God willing, the weather will be much improved by the time you read this. What a winter this has been!

The good news is that Lent is off to a good start in our parish. I was not only pleased, but inspired, by the crowds at Mass on Ash Wednesday. It was real pleasure to celebrate Mass with so many people to start this holy season.

The first Stations of the Cross have also been well attended. My hope is that everyone will get to the Stations at least once this Lent – if not most Fridays. They are a beautiful devotion that helps us meditate on all that our Lord did for us that First Good Friday. Remember that we also hear Confessions after the Stations of the Cross at 3 and 7 PM.

Please pray for the 8th graders in our parish school and CCD program. They will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this Tuesday. Pray that they will always be open to the promptings and guidance of the Holy Spirit Who strengthens them in Confirmation.

I want to thank all the teachers and catechists who prepared our students for Confirmation. I know it is a labor of love. I also know how much time and effort goes into preparing classes and teaching effectively. Thanks also to Mrs. Katie Frame, our Religious Education Director, for all she does.

A special thank you is due all those who have already supported this year's Bishop's Annual Appeal. Our parish goal is \$120,000. This figure is determined by our annual parish ordinary income (basically the amount you generously give through the regular collection on Sunday).

Thus far, \$38,309 has been pledged to this year's appeal. That represents almost 32% of our goal. The average gift so far is \$311.46. There were both larger and smaller gifts – given according to people's means. Thanks to one and all.

I want to encourage everyone who has yet to support the Bishop's Appeal to do so. The same goes for our ongoing Parish Capital Campaign. I am happy to report that we are still getting new pledges – and especially one-time gifts – to our campaign. Regardless of the amount, every gift helps. It would be great to see every family of the parish give something – no matter how large or small – according to their means.

As many of you know, the Scriptures encourage people to support the Lord's work – according to their means. In the Old Testament, this was spelled out as 10% of one's annual income. In those ancient times, it often meant farmers donating 10% of their grain and shepherds 10% of their flock!

In the New Testament, the amount is more or less left to the discretion of the giver. Nonetheless, St. Paul particularly encourages us to give generously (2 Corinthians 9:6 – 7) – and even reminds us that 'the Lord loves a cheerful giver.' And we cannot forget Jesus' praise of the widow who, though she could not give much, gave what she could from her heart (Luke 21:1 – 4, Mark 12:41 ff).

While generosity is always called for, Lent is a very special time for it. Jesus says that almsgiving helps atone for sins (Luke 11:41). What we do for the least of His people, we do for Him (Matthew 25:40.)

Let's also be generous with our prayers! I am so grateful that so many of you pray a Hail Mary for me each day. You all have a place in my prayers. Let's keep praying for the poor, the sick, for our parish, and for peace. Have a great week!

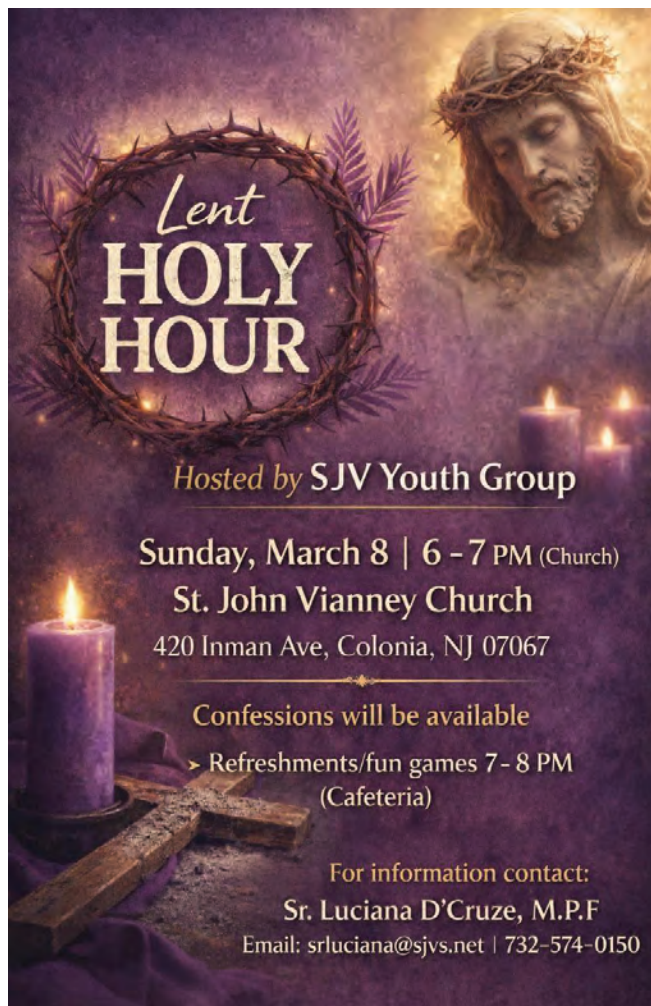

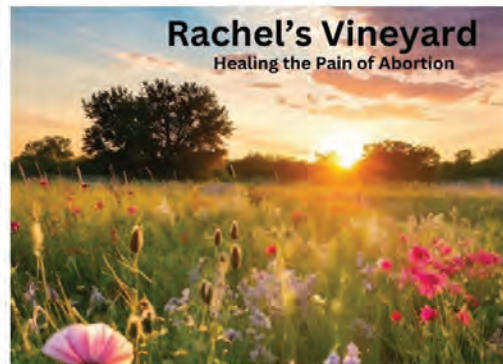

**Diocese of Metuchen
2026 Lenten Obligations**

The days of both **fast** and **abstinence** are **Ash Wednesday** (February 18) and **Good Friday** (April 3).

1. The other **Fridays** of Lent (Feb. 20, 27, Mar. 6, 13, 20, and 27) are days of **abstinence**.
2. **Fasting** in the Roman Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal with two smaller meals which together do not equal the size of your full meal. The obligation of fasting applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.
3. **Abstinence** in the Roman Catholic tradition means to abstain from eating meat (beef, chicken, pork, turkey, etc.). The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14.

Gospel Today

Second Sunday of Lent | Matthew 17:1-9

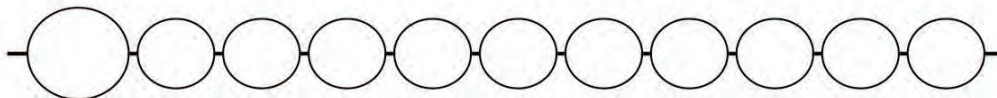
