Bingo in Burlington

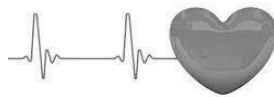

Health Ministry Tips: Women and Heart Disease



It's worth remembering that heart disease is the leading cause of death for African American and Caucasian women in the U.S. In 2009, the disease took almost

300,000, or one in every four females. Here are some additional points to remember.

Heart disease isn't a "man's disease" as some think. In fact, men *and* women die of the disease in almost equal number each year. Despite increase in awareness, only 54 percent of women know that heart disease is their No. 1 killer.

About 5.8 percent of all white women, 7.6 percent of African American women, and 5.6 percent of Mexican American women have coronary heart disease.

Almost **two-thirds** (64 percent) of women who die suddenly of coronary heart disease have **no prior symptoms**, so even if you have no symptoms, you may still be at risk.

Symptoms: while some women have no symptoms, others experience angina (dull, heavy-to-sharp chest pain or discomfort), pain in neck/jaw/throat or in upper abdomen or back. This may occur during rest, begin during physical activity, or triggered by mental stress.

Women are more likely to describe chest pain that is sharp, burning and more frequently have pain in the neck, jaw, throat, abdomen or back. Sometimes heart disease may be silent and not diagnosed until one experiences signs/symptoms of a heart attack, heart failure, arrhythmia or stroke.

Risk Factors: high blood pressure, high LDL cholesterol, and smoking are key risk factors for heart disease. About half of Americans (49 percent) have at least one of these three risk factors.

Other medical conditions/lifestyle choices such as diabetes, overweight/obesity, poor diet, physical inactivity, excessive alcohol use and smoking can also raise the risk.

To reduce risk of heart disease, it's important that you know/regularly check your blood pressure, be tested for diabetes, quit smoking, make healthful food choices, limit alcohol intake to one drink a day, lower stress levels and find healthful ways to cope with stress.

U.S. Catholic Sisters Against Human Trafficking Update

February 8 was the feast day of St. Josephine Bakhita, a Sudanese girl who was enslaved at the age of 7 and named Bakhita, “Fortunate One”, by her captor. She experienced the physical and moral humiliations of slavery. St. Bakhita, canonized in 2000, is considered the patroness of kidnapped and trafficked children.
