## A Plenary Indulgence During This Year of Mercy

Pope Francis has granted that we may obtain a plenary indulgence during the Year of Mercy. An indulgence is described as a remission of the temporal punishment from sins that are already forgiven. Venial sins are forgiven at every Mass through the penitential rite or reception of Holy Communion. Mortal sins are forgiven through the Sacrament of Confession. A plenary indulgence removes all temporal punishment while a partial indulgence removes part of it.

To gain indulgences, either partial or plenary, it is necessary that the faithful:

- be in the state of grace (free from all sin);
- confess all mortal sins;
- receive Holy Eucharist;
- pray for the intentions of the Holy Father; and
- make a pilgrimage within 20 days to and pass through a Holy Door of Mercy.



## From the Parish Health Ministry: April is Autism Awareness Month

The Parish Health Ministry offers the following major symptoms of autism so that parents may become alert and aware of the possibility of the condition in infants and small children. Autism in New Jersey is showing up in 1 in 66 children, among the highest ratios in the country. Be aware, be vigilant, and, most of all, be pro-active.

#### Communication

- Cannot explain what he/she wants
- Language skills are slow, speech is delayed
- Doesn't point or wave bye-bye
- Used to say words, now does not
- Does not respond to his/her name by 12 months

#### Social Features

- Doesn't smile when smiled at
- Has poor eye contact
- Prefers to play alone

#### Repetitive Behavior

- Gets "stuck" doing the same things over and over
- Unusual attachment to objects or routines
- Spends time lining things up in specific order

#### Other characteristics

- Doesn't play "pretend" by 18 months of age
- Has odd movement patterns
- Walks on his/her toes
- Doesn't respond to silly faces
- Seems overly sensitive to noise
- Seems to "zone out" or wander without purpose
