# Iconography Workshop Returns to St. Mary of the Lakes



The Prosopon School returns to St. Mary of the Lakes with an intensive icon workshop/retreat at our parish beginning September 9th in the Emmaus Center. Students will have the opportunity to create a Byzantine -style sacred icon using natural materials: wood panels with

natural gesso, genuine gold leaf, and egg tempera. The focus will be on the icon writer's spiritual growth through prayer, lectures, and the practice of the ancient technique of iconography. Artistic experience is helpful, though not necessary, as icon "writing" is a form of contemplative prayer, as well as an artistic practice. All are welcome.

Master iconographer Dmitri Andreyev will conduct the class. Born in St. Petersburg, Russia, Dmitri came to America in 1991 to study traditional iconography with his father, Vladislav Andrejev, master iconographer and founder of the Prosopon School of Iconology.



### July Health Tip from Our Parish Health Ministry

#### Cutting Fat in Baked Goods



To reduce the fat by  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{3}{4}$  in muffins, cakes, quick breads and other baked goods, substitute non-fat ricotta cheese, non-fat plain yogurt, or pureed fruit (e.g., applesauce, mashed banana, pureed prunes) for the entire amount of fat called for in the recipe. Add back 1-3 teaspoons of oil, e.g., if recipe calls for  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of oil, use  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup ricotta cheese or plain yogurt and 1-3 teaspoons of canola oil.

To reduce the fat in cookies, brownies, or other similar baked goods by up to 2/3, substitute equal parts of non-fat ricotta cheese, non-fat yogurt, margarine, non-fat cream cheese (not from a tub) for entire amount of fat called for in recipe. For example, if recipe calls for 1 cup of margarine, use 1/3 cup of non-fat plain yogurt, 1/3 cup margarine, and 1/3 cup non-fat cream cheese.



To reduce fat by  $\frac{1}{2}$  in a pie crust, substitute  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the shortening with cold non-fat cream cheese, (not from a tub). Chill dough for 1-2 hours before rolling out; do not over roll. For example, if recipe calls for  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup shortening, use  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup margarine or shortening and  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup non-fat cream cheese instead.

#### Helpful Hints

Applesauce - Reduce sugar in recipe if the applesauce is sweetened
Pureed Prunes - Good for chocolate desserts
Mashed Bananas - Brown spotted ripe bananas work best
Shredded Carrots - Good with orange and spice-flavored baked goods
Shredded Zucchini - Best in chocolate cakes
Pureed Pumpkin or Mashed Sweet Potatoes - Best in spice-flavored baked goods
