From the Pastor's Desk

Currently, the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) is underway ANNUAL throughout the Diocese of Trenton.

Each year, the Bishop seeks the support of our parishes, our clergy, Catholic education and social services.

Each of us has a vital part in all we do in Christ's name, and each of us can share in all we do with a gift to the ACA. The ACA gives us the opportunity to support the Church beyond our parish.

This year, St. Mary of the Lakes' goal is \$139,600. As in past years, 15 percent of the goal, or \$20,940 will be returned to St. Mary of the Lakes in the form of a parish rebate. Once we surpass our goal, 50 percent of all gifts will be returned to the parish.

Last year's generous response allowed our parish to exceed our goal by 11 percent with total received pledges of \$155,405 and this gives a total parish rebate of \$29,140.

We hope your generosity will allow for the same results this year and we thank you in advance for making a gift to this year's ACA!

As your family prepares to take up this call to help those in need, the following prayer can be said for those who are supported by the mission of CRS: "God, You are the source of every blessing, May we be mindful of your presence now as we use these CRS Rice Bowls in prayer, fasting and almsgiving. To apply, vocal recordings must be submitted; a recommendation form submitted from a music teacher/choir director or person that can speak to the student's work ethic and music background is also required.

24 Hours of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with Confession



The Diocese of Trenton is invited to celebrate "24 Hours for the Lord," an extended period of confessions and Eucharistic adoration on Friday-Saturday of the Third Week of Lent, **March 29-30**. This year's theme, suggested by the Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization is "Compassion." Last year, 10 parishes of the Diocese — at least one in each county Vicariate — hosted a "24 Hours" with various adaptations determined by the parishes.

An excerpt from Pope Francis' Lenten Message reads: Above all, I urge the members of the Church to take up the Lenten journey with enthusiasm, sustained by almsgiving, fasting and prayer. If, at times, the flame of charity seems to die in our own hearts, know that this is never the case in the heart of God! He constantly gives us a chance to begin loving anew. One such moment of grace will be, again this year, the "24 Hours for the Lord" initiative, which invites the entire Church community to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation in the context of Eucharistic adoration.

In 2019, inspired by the words of Psalm 130:4, "With you is forgiveness", this will take place from Friday, March 29 to Saturday, March 30. In each diocese, at least one church will remain open for twenty-four consecutive hours, offering an opportunity for both Eucharistic adoration and sacramental confession.

St. Mary of the Lakes will offer 24 Hours Adoration, which will begin here after the 9:00 a.m. Mass Friday, March 29, and will conclude with Benediction before the 9:00 a.m. Mass Saturday, March 30.

Confessions will be heard from 9:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. on Friday, March 29.





RCIA - THREE SCRUTINIES

The Elect, those preparing for all three Sacraments of Initiation at Easter, will be participating in three "Scrutinies" on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays in Lent. When we hear the term "scrutiny," we might be tempted to think that we are scrutinizing those preparing for baptism. The real scrutinizer is the living Word of God.

The purpose of the scrutinies is twofold. They are prayers of freedom for the elect by the community (and indeed, for the parish community as well) to:

- Enlighten: Scrutinze and uncover healing for what is weak and sinful in ourselves, our world, and our Church; what keeps us from the love of God; and determine what areas of our hearts are in need of conversion
- *Purify*: Ask God to liberate us from the power of evil and to strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good, that enables us to remain faithful to God's abiding love. As our entire community is called to journey with our Elect, we recognize the need we all share for freedom from sin and its effects.

ACTION ALERT

On Monday, **March 25**, A1504/S1072, the Aid in Dying bill will be voted on in both the Senate and the Assembly.

This assisted suicide bill is a direct threat to anyone viewed as a cost liability to an insurance company. In an era of cost control and managed care, patients with lingering illnesses may be branded as an economic liability, and decisions to encourage death could be driven by cost.

The facts are clear – in California, in Vermont, and in Oregon – states that have passed assisted suicide bills – insurance companies have denied individuals healthcare coverage, but offered them low cost drugs to end their life.


