

Welcome to St. Mary of the Lakes: Kathy LaPrete

THIS IS MY BODY. THIS IS MY BLOOD.

One of the most troubling things I read all summer was the finding of a Pew Research Study released August 5 that only 31% or one-third of current, self-identifying Catholics believe that the bread and wine consecrated at Mass BECOME AND ARE the Body and Blood of Christ. This belief, described and known since the Middle Ages as "transubstantiation" in Catholic doctrine, has been and remains a core conviction of the Catholic faith since the Lord Jesus first spoke the words "This is my Body ... this is my Blood" at the Last Supper (Mark 14:22-25; Luke 22:18-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-25). "Do this in memory of me." 69% of Catholics surveyed, by contrast, believe the consecrated bread and wine only to be "symbols" of the Lord Jesus' Body and Blood.

Where did this error regarding such a fundamental tenet of our Catholic faith come from?

The Pew Survey reveals that the Church's teaching and belief in the Eucharist is stronger among those who attend Mass weekly, especially older Catholics, but even within these groups confusion and error exist to a troubling degree.

There is abundant evidence derived from the scriptures, the writings of the earliest Fathers of the Church, the pronouncements of Church Councils and leaders throughout the Church's long history as well as the firm and constant belief of the Church's faithful, to support this most important and central conviction of our Catholic faith. The Eucharist is the "Real Presence" of the Lord Jesus Christ, whether on the altar at Mass, in Holy Communion or reserved as the Blessed Sacrament In the tabernacle. For the Catholic, this "mystery of faith" is unambiguous and not subject to doubt. The Catechism of the Catholic Church, citing the Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church "Lumen Gentium, 11," states with the deepest and most profound conviction, "The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life ... For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch (CCC, 1324)."

How bread and wine actually become the Body and Blood of Christ at the priest's words of consecration at Mass is a mystery of faith to be sure but a mystery that respond's to the Lord Jesus' own command, "Do this in memory of Me." Mysteries defy scientific explanations — that is why they are called "mysteries" — requiring either the belief of faith or disbelief. In his magnificent Eucharistic hymn, "Tantum Ergo," one of the Catholic Church's greatest teachers, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225–1274), reflected "what our senses fail to fathom, let us grasp through faith's consent." And, so, the Catholic Church has "grasped" from its very beginning and continues to do so to the present moment and beyond.

"This is my Body. This is my Blood. Do this in memory of me."

"May the Heart of Jesus, in the Most Blessed Sacrament, be praised, adored and loved with grateful affection, at every moment, in all the tabernacles of the world, even to the end of time. Amen (Divine Praises)."

If the faithful of the Catholic Church get this core belief wrong, what else could they hope to get right?



Continuing to Exceed Our Goal

The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) is ongoing throughout the Diocese of Trenton.

Each year, the Bishop seeks the support of our parishes, our clergy, Catholic education and social services.

Each of us has a vital part in all we do in Christ's name, and each of us can share in all we do with a gift to the ACA. The ACA gives us the opportunity to support the Church beyond our parish.

To date, SML has pledged \$146,439 to top our goal of \$139,600. By reaching our goal, the rebate will be \$20,960 (15 percent of goal). By continuing to exceed our goal, the rebate will be \$20,960 + 50 percent of difference above \$139,600. Therefore, when all pledges are paid, St. Mary of the Lakes will receive a parish rebate of \$24,379.50.

Last year's generous response allowed our parish to exceed our goal by 11 percent with total received pledges of \$155,405 and this gives a total parish rebate of \$29,140.

We hope your generosity will allow for the same results this year and we thank you in advance for making a gift to this year's ACA!

Eucharistic Adoration — Refection by St. Alphonsus Liguori

St. John says that he saw Our Lord girt up with a golden girdle, which supported His breasts: I saw One like to a son of man girt about the breasts with a golden girdle. (Apoc. 1, 12f.) Thus also is Jesus in the Sacrament of the Altar, with His breasts all filled with milk; that is to say, with the graces which, in His mercy, He desires to bestow upon us. And as a mother, whose breasts are overcharged with milk, goes about seeking for children who may draw it off, and relieve her of its weight, so also does He call out to us, You shall be carried at the breasts. (Isa. 66,12.)

The Venerable Father Alvarez saw Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament with His hands filled with graces, and seeking to whom He might dispense them.

0 most beloved and only-begotten Son of the Eternal Father, I know that Thou art the object most worthy of being loved. I desire to love Thee as much as Thou deservest to be loved, or at least as much as a soul can ever desire to love Thee. I fully understand that I, who am a traitor and so great a rebel to Thy love, deserve not to love Thee, neither do I deserve to approach so near to Thee as I now am in this church. I hear Thee say, My son, give Me thy heart. (Prov. 23, 26.) Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart. (Matt. 22, 37.) I understand that it is for this end that Thou hast spared my life, and not sent me to hell, that I might be converted and turn all my affections to Thee. Since, then, Thou art pleased that even I should love Thee, oh, yes, my God, I will do so.

Behold me: to Thee I yield myself up; I give myself to Thee; I love Thee. O God! All goodness, all love. I choose Thee for the only king and lord of my poor heart. Thou desirest it, and my will is to give it to Thee: it is cold, it is loathsome; but if Thou acceptest it, Thou wilt change it. Change me, my Lord, change me; I no longer have courage to live as I have hitherto done, ungrateful, and with so little love towards Thy infinite goodness, which loves me so much, and deserves an infinite love. Enable me to supply from this day forward for all the love which I have hitherto failed to bear Thee.

Ejaculation. My God, my God, I will love Thee, I will love Thee, I will love Thee!



You Can Understand The Bible!



Sign-Up Dates are in September

The Bible is at the heart of our Faith and our relationship with God. Scripture informs our beliefs and inspires our devotions. It is the place where our Father meets with us and lovingly speaks to us. Reading the Bible should bring us closer to Christ, but understanding it is often difficult. The good news is that you can understand the Bible, and The Bible Timeline makes it easy.

The Bible Timeline is a Catholic Bible study that can help anyone to make sense of Scripture and experience the life-changing power of God's Word. This study takes you on a journey through the entire Bible and deep into each period of salvation history, where you will discover the amazing story woven throughout all of Scripture.

National Catholic Youth Conference







UPCOMING VIRTUS TRAINING SESSIONS



The Diocese of Trenton requires anyone over the age of 18 who participates in a Parish ministry to attend a VIRTUS training session every four years to safeguard children and vulnerable adults. Note that this is a change from the previous VIRTUS requirement. What this means is that every adult who currently volunteers for SML Church, School, or PREP and has not previously attended a VIRTUS session, or who has not taken a refresher course within the past four years, must attend a class as soon as possible.

VIRTUS Training Sessions are offered at parishes throughout the Diocese. During the months of September and October, St. Mary of the Lakes will offer the following sessions: 9/12 at 10:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. (*The September 12 Virtus Session at 6:30 p.m. will be a re-certification class for those who have previously attended a Virtus class - those who have never attended Virtus will need to choose another session listed.*) in the Parish Meeting Room (PMR) at the School; 9/19 at 10:00 a.m. in the Prep Conference Room (PCR) at the School; 10/10 at 10:00 a.m. in the PCR; and 10/17 at 10:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. in the PCR.
