Mrs. Sobel comes to us from the Evesham Township School District where she worked in an administrative capacity for ten years. She was the principal at Robert B. Jaggard Elementary School. Prior to that, she worked as a curriculum supervisor in the district. Maria is an advocate for all students wanting to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to grow and learn.

Mrs. Sobel is honored to accept this position and is looking forward to meeting the students, families, and staff at St. Mary of the Lakes. Maria feels blessed that she will have this opportunity to work in a Catholic School and Parish community where she can foster and nourish the spiritual, academic, and social development of the students.

Mrs. Sobel and Mrs. Rash will work together for five weeks so that there is ample time for meeting members of the community, conveying information and ensuring continuity.

Charity Golf Tournament Needs Your Support to Help the Homeless

The Knights of Columbus are hosting their 13th annual charity golf tournament on Monday, **October 26**, at Medford Village Country Club. One of this year's beneficiaries is Family Promise of Burlington County (formerly Interfaith Hospitality Network), a non-profit interfaith organization committed to a united outreach by the religious community in Burlington County providing shelter, meals and assistance to homeless families. The program provides help, hope and a safe haven for guests while they seek affordable housing. Since 1998 Family Promise has hosted about 430 families totaling more than 1,400 individuals, including about 900 children.

Tax-deductible sponsorship (see page on left) opportunities are available for businesses and individuals. **Golf registration** is open for 136 golfers (\$150, or \$165 *after Sept. 21*) and includes greens fee, golf cart, continental breakfast, beverages on the course, and dinner. 
A Coronavirus Prayer
