Welcome to St. Mary of the Lakes: Bernadette McNally

Take a Year and Strengthen Your Spiritual Life by Increasing the Size of Your Cross

On October 26, 2020, Father Dan gave a homily about two dimensions of Christian Spirituality: the **vertical** and **horizontal**, resembling the Cross, and the things we do to that help lengthen or widen that cross. He said:

The vertical dimension of Christian spirituality, symbolized by the vertical beam of the cross, represents the relationship we have with God "above," to love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind. It's the above part is why we call it "vertical," even though God is in others and inside ourselves as well. People with a high vertical spirituality carry a tall cross, and invest most of their spiritual effort on improving or maintaining their relationship with God...

The horizontal dimension of Christian spirituality, symbolized by the horizontal beam of the cross, represents the way your faith motivates you to treat other people. Love your neighbor as yourself. People with a high horizontal spirituality carry a wide cross.

There is also a third dimension: **internal**. This is the way we deal with what is going on inside ourselves.

Beginning the first Sunday of Advent, November 29, New Year's Day for the Church, we invite individuals, families, groups of friends, neighbors, ministries to make some spiritual New Year's resolutions to build their crosses, week by week, for a year.

In next week's bulletin, there will be a self-assessment to help us determine where God is prompting us to make changes in our spiritual life. Is your cross very tall, but maybe not so wide? Is your cross super wide, but really short? Is your cross shallow and in need of internal strengthening? We all need to work on some aspect of our spiritual life to strengthen our relationship with God. This exercise allows us to do it together in a COVID-proof way and helps us develop holy habits that draw us closer to the Lord and opens us up to a deeper relationship with Him.

Then, each week for the next year, in the bulletin and posted on social media, there will be three suggestions for building our crosses, one for each of the dimensions, to work on in the coming week. Maybe you'll decide to stay with the previous week's suggestion for two or more weeks. Maybe the Holy Spirit will inspire you with an idea of your own.

However the idea comes, let's take this year to build our crosses to grow in our love for our Lord in our hearts, our souls, in the way we treat our neighbors and the ways we treat ourselves because, no matter what, we are loved by the Beloved as His beloved.



Each scholarship winner must attend a college or trade school to receive payment. Payments will be made to the winner, not the school directly.


SML School 50/50 Raffle Update
