#### A Message from Bishop O'Connell

As the new year begins, there are many issues in society that challenge our Catholic moral and social teachings. Opposition to abortion remains our "pre-eminent priority."

During the month of January when we acknowledge the 48<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the fateful Supreme Court Roe v. Wade decision, 1 invite the clergy and faithful of the Diocese of Trenton to join one another in a common prayerful response:

- (1) pray the rosary daily for the rest of the month for an end to abortion in our country;
- (2) pray the newly created "Novena to St. Joseph" to end abortion (*below*) each day, **January 14 through 22**;
- (3) pray and fast to end abortion on the actual anniversary date, **January 22**, as parishes celebrate Masses for the legal protection of the unborn.

Since COVID precautions will restrict our usual participation in the annual March for Life in Washington on January 29, I will celebrate Mass online that day and many parishes will celebrate Masses in churches for all these intentions. As a Diocese, as parishes, let us pray for an end to abortion, for the legal protection of the unborn and in thanksgiving to God for the gift of human life.
