


Young Adults Ministry Invite

Caring for Homeless Families An Active Ministry at St. Mary's

For over 20 years the parishioners of St. Mary of the Lakes Church have supported and cared for homeless families in Burlington County though our participation in Interfaith Hospitality Network (IHN).

Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, we have been unable to use our network of churches to provide shelter for families. To accommodate, we have placed our families in motels, and as you can imagine, this is costly and not an ideal setting for children.

The good news is, we have a new vision, a new strategy and even a new name. IHN is now Family Promise. We remain part of the National Family Promise network and we will continue to serve families in need by providing both shelter and family support. In addition, we will continue to maintain our Parish Ministry to support the program and to provide opportunities for volunteers.

Our plan for the future is to use an Apartment Shelter Program to provide temporary housing and to offer case management to assist our guests find permanent housing, job opportunities and financial stability.



From the Pastor's Desk

The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) is ongoing throughout the Diocese of Trenton.

Each year, the Bishop seeks the support of our parishes, our clergy, Catholic education and social services.

Each of us has a vital part in all we do in Christ's name, and each of us can share in all we do with a gift to the ACA. The ACA gives us the opportunity to support the Church beyond our parish.

This year, St. Mary of the Lakes' goal is \$140,000. As in past years, 15 percent of the goal, or \$21,000 will be returned to St. Mary of the Lakes in the form of a parish rebate. Once we surpass our goal, 50 percent of all gifts will be returned to the parish.
