Thanks to the generosity of the parishioners who have made a gift to the Annual Catholic Appeal, St. Mary of the Lakes (SML) has once again reached its goal of \$140,000. Going forward, fifty percent of all gifts will be returned to SML in the form of a parish rebate. As of November 7th, our parish's estimated rebate earned is \$28,544.76. Those who have yet to make a gift may pick up a pledge card and return envelopes at the church doors. God is good, and so are you!

As of November 7th, SML has pledged \$165,511.85. We thank you for making a gift to this year's ACA!

Increased Offertory Appeal Update

As announced in the Stewardship Report given at all Masses by Father Dan the weekend of September 24-25, St. Mary of the Lakes is launching an increased giving appeal. The objectives of the appeal are:

- to encourage all parishioners to use the envelope system regularly;
- to introduce and reaffirm the concepts of Christian stewardship;
- to request a reasonable weekly increase in the offering by all parishioners.

As of November 8th, 197 envelope users increased their weekly contribution in response to my letter, representing a weekly increase of \$1,644.00. Seventeen non-envelope users are now using envelopes and have increased their weekly contributions by \$326.00. Six parishioners made an outright gift to the parish totaling, \$1,850.00. Three parishioners requested electronic giving information, while four requested envelopes. One parishioner requested information for a planned gift. The average increase in individual weekly offerings is \$9.20. In total, 214 families have responded with an increased giving totaling \$1,969.00.

Those who have not responded by today will receive the third in-house letter asking them to participate in the increased offertory appeal. Parishioners are asked to respond by using the special stewardship envelope to indicate their new level of giving. Then, in succeeding weeks, return to using the regular envelope packet. Egivers are asked to go to www.smlparish.org, and click on GIVING and make changes to indicate your new level of giving. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

VIRTUS Online

The Diocese of Trenton requires anyone over 18 who participates in a parish ministry to attend a VIRTUS training session every four years to safeguard children and vulnerable adults. This means every adult who currently volunteers for SML Church, School, or PREP and has not previously attended a VIRTUS session, or who has not taken a refresher course in the past four years, must attend a session as soon as possible.

VIRTUS training sessions are offered at parishes throughout the diocese. Parishioners are permitted to attend training at any parish in the diocese. This month, St. Mary of the Lakes will offer the initial certification class for those who have never been previously certified "Protecting God's Children" on Monday, November 28th, from 6:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. in the Emmaus Center.

Pre-registration is mandatory at <u>virtusonline.org</u> as space is limited.

The Diocese of Trenton is committed to the initiatives outlined in the U.S. Bishops' Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People in regard to the reporting and investigation of sexual abuse allegations involving minors. The Diocese has in place a Victim's Assistance Coordinator, who is available to obtain support for your needs and help you make a formal complaint of abuse.

The Diocese encourages anyone with an allegation to also report that abuse to their local law enforcement agency. The Diocese reports all allegations received to the appropriate county prosecutor's office.

Twenty-First Visit to the Most Holy Sacrament

Wheresoever the body shall be, thither will the eagles also be gathered together. [Matt. xxiv. 23] The Saints generally understand by this body that of Jesus Christ; and by the eagles, souls who being detached from creatures, rise above the things of the earth, and fly towards Heaven, after which they always sigh in thought and affection, and where they constantly dwell. These eagles also find their paradise on earth wherever they find Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament; so much so, indeed, that they seem never to tire hovering around Him. If eagles, says St. Jerome, [In Matt. loco cit.] on scenting a dead body go from afar to seek it, how much more should we run and fly to Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament, as to the most delicious food of our hearts! Hence Saints in this valley of tears have always as parched harts run to this fountain of paradise. Father Balthasar Alvarez, of the Society of Jesus, in whatever occupation he was engaged, used often to cast his eyes towards the place in which he knew that the Blessed Sacrament was; he often visited it, and even spent entire nights before it. He used to weep when he saw the palaces of the great ones of this world filled with people, who courted a man from whom they hoped for some miserable earthly good, and the churches so abandoned, in which the supreme sovereign of the world dwells, and remains with us as on a throne of love, rich in immense and eternal treasures. He used also to say, that religious persons were indeed fortunate, because in the very houses in which they reside, they can, whenever they please, either night or day, visit this great Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament; and this lay people cannot do.

Since, then, my most loving Lord, notwithstanding that Thou seest me as a leper, and so ungrateful to Thy love, Thou invitest me to approach Thee, I will not be discouraged at the sight of my miseries: I come and approach thee; but do Thou wholly change me. Drive from me every love which is not for Thee, every desire which displeases Thee, every thought which does not tend toward Thee. My Jesus, my love, my treasure, my all, I am determined to please Thee alone. I will give pleasure only to Thee. Thou alone deservest all my love; Thee only will I love with my whole heart. Detach me from everything, my Lord, and bind me to Thyself alone; but bind me so firmly, that I may never more be able to separate myself from Thee, either in this life or in the next.

Ejaculatory prayer: My most sweet Jesus, never allow me to be separated from Thee!

Called by Name in November

At each weekend Mass in November, parishioners are asked to make a name tag and wear it to Mass so they can be "Called by Name." (Isaiah 43:1)

Fathers Dan and Roy try their best to learn the names of parishioners. One way Father Dan cheats is when he sees two parishioners having a conversation, he waits until the conversation ends, then asks the parishioner whose name he knows, the name of the parishioner whose name he doesn't know. Many times, the answer is, "I don't know. I see (him/her) at church all the time and I don't know their name."

So Called by Name in November will be a big help to those, who, like Father Dan, are visual learners. Your participation will be appreciated! Name tags will be provided at all entrances.

November Health Tips from your Parish Health Ministry

1-Minute Tip: Take a minute to think about what you're thankful for, and share it with your friends and family. Practicing this simple positive thinking exercise will decrease your stress and get you ready for the day.

5-Minute Tip: Put out fresh cut flowers for you and your Thanksgiving guests! New research shows that people report feeling happier and more energetic after looking at flowers – and they'll make your abode smell fresh.

15-Minute Tip: Eat breakfast! Don't try to 'save up' calories for the Thanksgiving meal – you'll end up overindulging. Start the day with a filling breakfast like hot whole-grain cereal or an egg white omelet with veggies.

30-Minute Tip: Thanksgiving means turkey! But when handled or prepared improperly, poultry can spread bacteria, resulting in foodborne illness. Thaw the turkey slowly in the refrigerator or cold water, according to instructions. Be sure to take the time to clean any surface the turkey has come in contact with thoroughly. Opt for cooking stuffing outside of the turkey rather than inside, to be sure the turkey cooks all the way through. Use a food thermometer – a turkey that has reached a minimum internal temperature of 165 degrees is safe to eat.


