Kitchen and Lunch Service Manager

St. Mary of the Lakes Catholic School in Medford seeks a part-time kitchen and lunch manager, beginning immediately. This includes finishing this school year through mid-June and leadership for next school year starting in late August/ September. Our school kitchen and lunch service manager will organize, train, and lead a group of school volunteers in preparing and distributing meals by grade. This includes weekly and daily scheduling of the volunteers and providing team direction. The manager's key responsibilities include lunch preparation, distribution of prepared meals, heating up parent-supplied meals, and meal tracking for all students.

In addition, the kitchen and lunch service manager will be the point person weekly to provide lunch choices to school families and process the orders with our food service provider. This process includes gathering each student's specific orders, labeling the lunches per day by student, and ordering other supplies needed weekly, including milk, produce, and utensils.

Candidates with cafeteria and food service experience are preferred and must be able to work minimally from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. daily, Monday – Friday. In addition, on Mondays and Fridays, an additional 1–2 hours will likely be required to organize the weekly menu and order the meals for the week. A successful candidate will be subject to fingerprinting and background checks and will also have to attend Virtus training.

Rite of Sending to the Rite of Election

Our community here at St. Mary of the Lakes will be sending our catechumen, Paul Lewis, Jr., Kyle Porterfield, and Raymond Woodrow, to the Rite of Election at St. Robert Bellarmine Co-Cathedral in Freehold with Bishop O'Connell. All catechumens of our diocese, and all the dioceses in the world, who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil, will be presented to their bishops for "election" to the Sacraments on the First Sunday of Lent.

During the Rite of Sending at the parish, the candidates sign the Book of the Elect as a symbol of their election or being chosen by God. This book is included in the celebration at the Cathedral where all the parishes present both their catechumens and their names enrolled in the Books of the Elect.

At the Rite of Election, the catechumens are "elected" (chosen by name; chosen by God) for the Easter Sacraments of Initiation. The Church acts in God's name. Bishop O'Connell echoes God's call, but rather than focus on the "Elect," we focus on the marvelous action of God in the lives of the Elect.

The sparrow hath found herself a house, and the turtle a nest for herself, where she may lay her young ones! Thy Altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God. [Ps. lxxxiii. 4] The sparrow, says David, finds a dwelling in houses; turtle-doves in nests: but Thou, my king and my God, hast made Thyself a nest and found a dwelling on earth on our Altars, that we might find Thee, and that Thou mightest dwell amongst us.

Lord, we cannot but say, that Thou art too much enamoured of men; Thou no longer knowest what to do to gain their love. But do Thou, my most amiable Jesus, give us the grace that we also may be passionately enamoured of Thee. It would indeed be unreasonable were we cold in our love towards a God Who loves us with such affection. Draw us to Thee by the sweet attractions of Thy love; make us understand the endearing claims which Thou hast on our love.

O infinite Majesty and infinite Goodness, Thou lovest men so much, Thou hast done so much that Thou mightest be loved by men: how is it, then, that amongst men there are so few who love Thee? I will no longer be as I have hitherto been, of the unhappy number of those ungrateful creatures: I am resolved to love Thee as much as I can, and to love no other than Thee: Thou deservest it; Thou commandest me with so much earnestness to do so, I am resolved to satisfy Thee. Grant, O God of my soul, that I may fully satisfy Thee. I entreat Thee to grant me this favor by the merits of Thy Passion, and I confidently hope for it. Bestow the goods of the earth on those who desire them; I desire and seek the great treasure of Thy love alone. I love Thee, my Jesus; I love Thee, infinite Goodness. Thou art all my riches, my whole satisfaction, my entire love.


Ejaculatory prayer. My Jesus, Thou hast given Thy whole self to me; I give my whole self to Thee!

March 25th, 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m., Philadelphia, PA.


This pilgrimage will include a tour and talk at the shrine, the opportunity for confession, a gift shop visit, Mass, and a cobb salad lunch following Mass on site.


