






Lending Library

Charity Golf Tournament Needs Your Support to Help the Less Fortunate

Medford Knights Charity Fund, a New Jersey nonprofit corporation, is hosting its 16th annual charity golf tournament on Monday, June 26 at Medford Lakes Country Club. One of this year's beneficiaries is Family Promise of Burlington County, a non-profit interfaith organization committed to a united outreach by the religious community in Burlington County, providing shelter, meals, and assistance to homeless families.

The program provides help, hope, and a safe haven for guests while they seek affordable housing. Since 1997, Family Promise has hosted 500 families and more than 1,000 children. In 2022, Family Promise provided 4,000 total nights of shelter. Family Promise also provides direct financial assistance to families at risk of eviction or foreclosure, distributing over \$150,000 to 28 families in 2022.

Tax-deductible sponsorship opportunities are available for businesses and individuals to help Family Promise continue to provide critical services.

Golf registration is \$195 per person (\$215 after April 28) and includes greens fee, golf cart, lunch, gifts for all participants, beverages and snacks on the course, a cocktail hour with hors d'oeuvres, and dinner. The tournament is a scramble format for 144 golfers and begins with a shotgun start at 12:00 p.m. Dinner-only tickets are also available for \$65 each. Awards, gift baskets, and multiple raffles offer opportunities to win great prizes.

Kitchen and Lunch Service Manager

St. Mary of the Lakes Catholic School in Medford seeks a part-time kitchen and lunch manager, beginning immediately. This includes finishing this school year through mid-June and leadership for next school year starting in late August/ September. Our school kitchen and lunch service manager will organize, train, and lead a group of school volunteers in preparing and distributing meals by grade. This includes weekly and daily scheduling of the volunteers and providing team direction. The manager's key responsibilities include lunch preparation, distribution of prepared meals, heating up parent-supplied meals, and meal tracking for all students.

In addition, the kitchen and lunch service manager will be the point person weekly to provide lunch choices to school families and process the orders with our food service provider. This process includes gathering each student's specific orders, labeling the lunches per day by student, and ordering other supplies needed weekly, including milk, produce, and utensils.

Candidates with cafeteria and food service experience are preferred and must be able to work minimally from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. daily, Monday - Friday. In addition, on Mondays and Fridays, an additional 1-2 hours will likely be required to organize the weekly menu and order the meals for the week. A successful candidate will be subject to fingerprinting and background checks and will also have to attend Virtus training.

After Care

Responsibilities include supervising students as they complete homework, play, complete crafts, and have quiet time. Handyman/Custodian

Perform ongoing repairs for the buildings, such as light electrical, light plumbing, and painting. Ability to safely use common power and hand tools to do simple repairs, e.g., doors/windows/gutters.

The candidate must have effective communication skills and be a self-starter with good time management skills. The Handyman/Custodian will function as a representative with outside contractors and inspectors coming onto the property or into the building.

The Handyman/Custodian will report to the Facilities Manager. Part-time hours are 12 noon to 4:00 p.m. Benefits and salary are commensurate with experience. Schedule will include some overtime and potential work on holidays. 

The Catechism Corner

Lead Us Not Into Temptation

"This petition goes to the root of the preceding one, for our sins result from our consenting to temptation; we therefore ask our Father not to 'lead' us into temptation. It is difficult to translate the Greek verb used by a single English word: the Greek means both 'do not allow us to enter into temptation' and 'do not let us yield to temptation.' 'God cannot be tempted by evil and he himself tempts no one'; on the contrary, he wants to set us free from evil. We ask him not to allow us to take the way that leads to sin. We are engaged in the battle 'between flesh and spirit'; this petition implores the Spirit of discernment and strength."

Eighth Visit to the Most Holy Sacrament

St. John says that he saw our Lord girt up with a golden girdle, which supported His breasts: I saw the Son of Man girt about the paps with a golden girdle. [Apoc. i. 12] Thus also is Jesus in the Sacrament of the Altar, with His breasts all filled with milk; that is to say, with the graces which, in His mercy, He desires to bestow upon us. And as a mother, whose breasts are overcharged with milk goes about seeking for children who may draw it off, and relieve her of its weight, [St. Francis de Sales, in his treatise The Love of God, B. 1, ch. 15, uses the same comparison in explaining it, to show us that the Divine goodness takes greater pleasure in giving us His graces than we do in receiving them. ———ED.] so also does He call out to us, You shall be carried at the breasts. [Isa. lxvi. 13]

The Venerable Father Alvarez saw Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament with his hands filled with graces, and seeking to whom He might dispense them. Of St. Catherine of Sienna it is related, that when she approached the Most Holy Sacrament, she did so precisely with the same loving avidity with which a child flies to its mother's breast,

O most beloved and only-begotten Son of the Eternal Father, I know that Thou art the object most worthy of being loved. I desire to love Thee as much as Thou deservest to be loved, or at least as much as a soul can ever desire to love Thee, I fully understand that I, who am a traitor, and so great a rebel to Thy love, deserve not to love Thee, neither do I deserve to approach Thee so near as I now am in this church, but I feel that Thou, for all this, seekest my love; I hear Thee say My son, give Me thy heart. [Prov. xxiii, 26] Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart. [Matt. xxii. 37] I understand that it is for this end that Thou hast spared my life, and not sent me to Hell, that I might be converted and turn all my affections to Thee Since, then, Thou art pleased that even I should love Thee, oh, yes, my God, I will do so. Behold me: to Thee I yield myself up; I give myself to Thee; I love Thee. O God! all goodness, all love, I choose Thee for the only king and lord of my poor heart. Thou desirest it, and my will is to give it to Thee: it is cold, it is loathsome; but if Thou acceptest it, Thou wilt change it. Change me, my Lord, change me; I no longer have courage to live as I have hitherto done, ungrateful, and with so little love towards Thine infinite goodness, which loves me so much, and deserves an infinite love. Enable me to supply from this day forward i for all the love which I have hitherto failed to bear Thee.

Ejaculatory prayer. My God, my God, I will love Thee, I will love Thee!

VIRTUS Online

The Diocese of Trenton requires anyone over 18 who participates in a parish ministry to attend a VIRTUS training session every four years to safeguard children and vulnerable adults. This means every adult who currently volunteers for SML Church, School, or PREP and has not previously attended a VIRTUS session, or who has not taken a refresher course in the past four years, must attend a session as soon as possible.

VIRTUS training sessions are offered at parishes throughout the diocese. Parishioners are permitted to attend training at any parish in the diocese. In April, St. Mary of the Lakes will offer the initial certification class for those who have never been previously certified on Wednesday, April 12th, at 6:30 p.m. in the Emmaus Center. The re-certification class will then be offered on Thursday, April 13th, at 6:30 p.m. also in the Emmaus Center.

Pre-registration is mandatory at <u>virtusonline.org</u> as space is limited.

The parish office is not able to register on your behalf.


