

Casseroles must be homemade and pre-frozen when delivered, as they are stored until the delivery volunteers can take them to the organizations this ministry supports. Students can record three service hours per month for a donation. To receive service hours, students must be involved in the casserole's preparation. #### Part Time Role - (PE) Gym Teacher

St. Mary of the Lakes Catholic School Gym Teacher (Physical Education) is responsible for planning and implementing physical education activities for students ranging from PreK to 8th grade. Additionally, he/she monitors students and evaluates student achievement of goals. This teacher emphasizes sports related skills, games, movement patterns, and general fitness activities all within an environment that embraces our Catholic Identity. He/she maintains records and student information for gym class. They are responsible for communication with all parties relating to the progress of students in the gym class. The gym teacher participates in all faculty and staff engagements including in-service training. The gym teacher is responsible for planning annual events such as Field Day and other school-wide events. This is a 10 month part-time position (25-28 hours per week). Attendance is required for all scheduled school days and in-service training days. Job duties include preparing/setting up gym prior to school and equipment prior to each class. He/She prepares and implements engaging lesson plans, provides safe learning experiences for all students by explaining rules and safety guidelines for all gym games. A Teaching certification is required. Minimum 2-3 years experience supervising students / children in sports and/or group activities is preferred. Strong oral and written communication skills needed. The role requirements include being able to physically walk and stand for long periods of time and be able to carry, push, set up, and clean up required gym equipment

## VIRTUSOnline

The Diocese of Trenton requires anyone over 18 who participates in a parish ministry to attend a VIRTUS training session every four years to safeguard children and vulnerable adults. This means every adult who currently volunteers for SML Church, School, or PREP and has not previously attended a VIRTUS session, or who has not taken a refresher course in the past four years, must attend a session as soon as possible.

VIRTUS training sessions are offered at parishes throughout the diocese. Parishioners are permitted to attend training at any parish in the diocese. On Monday, August 21, at 7:00 p.m. in the Emmaus Center, St. Mary of the Lakes will offer the recertification class for those who have been previously certified but whose certification is, or soon will be, expired.

Pre-registration is *mandatory* at <u>virtusonline.org</u> as space is limited.

#### Twenty-Seventh Visit to the Blessed Sacrament

The holy Church sings in the Office of the Most Blessed Sacrament: "There is no other country, however great, whose gods are nigh it as our God is nigh to us." [Resp. 7,----Deut. iv. 7] When the Gentiles heard how far our God carried His works of love, they exclaimed: Oh, how good a God is this God of the Christians! And, indeed, although the Gentiles imagined their gods according to their own captices,----yet, if you read history, you will never find in all their fables, and among the many gods they invented, that they went so far as even to imagine a god as enamoured of men as is our true God. Who, to show His love for His adorers, and to enrich them with graces, has worked such a prodigy of love as to become their constant companion, and to remain night and day concealed on their Altars, seeming as if He knew not how to separate Himself from them, even for a moment: He hath made a remembrance of His wonderful works. [Ps. ex. 4] Thou, then, my most sweet Jesus, hast been pleased to work the greatest of Thy miracles in order to satisfy the excessive desire which Thou hast to remain always near and present to us. Why, then, do men fly from Thy Presence? And how can they live for so long a time at a distance from Thee, or visit Thee so seldom? How is it that whe<mark>n in Thy Presence they g</mark>et so weary that a quarter of an hour appears an age? Oh, patience of my Jesus, how great art Thou! Yes, my Lord, I understand Thee; Thy patience is great, because the love Thou bearest to men is great, and this it is which, so to say, forces Thee to dwell always in the midst of creatures so ungrateful. Ah, my God, Who, because Thou art infinite in perfections art also infinite in love, permit not that I should for the future be, as I have hitherto been, of the number of these ungrateful ones. Grant me a love equal to Thy merits and to my own obligations. At one time I also was weary in Thy Presence, either because I loved Thee not, or because I loved Thee too little; but if by Thy grace I am enabled to love Thee much, I shall no longer find it tedious to remain even for whole days and nights at Thy feet in the Most Holy Sacrament. O Eternal Father, I offer Thee Thine Own Son Himself; accept Him for me, and through His merits give me so ardent and tender a love towards the Most Blessed Sacrament, that, constantly turning towards some church in which He dwells, I may think of, and desire with longing anxiety, the time when I may be able to go and entertain myself in His Presence.

My God, for the love of Jesus, give me a great love towards the Most Blessed Sacrament!


