RCIA Reflection: Learning to Measure Correctly

Our society truly believes it has arrived by its successes in measuring and weighing everything and everyone. We are confident we have experienced the worst hurricane ever recorded; density of clouds can be measured; intelligence can be recorded by numbers; professional athletes can be traded because of a variation in their measurements. We seem to need to measure almost every individual experience or observation against some norm or standard. Jesus gives us a norm, a measurement, a standard by which to live. Christ presents an interrelationship of the love of God, and the love of self and others, as the most important measurement of life. If you, or someone you know would like to hear more about Jesus and about the norms and measurements that he extends to us, we invite you to join us at an Inquiry Session. Inquiry sessions DO NOT assume a commitment to join the Catholic Faith family. Inquiry sessions are opportunities to ask questions about God, Jesus, the Catholic Faith Family. All who are unbaptized, baptized into another faith denomination, or baptized Catholic but have not received Eucharist or Confirmation, are invited. 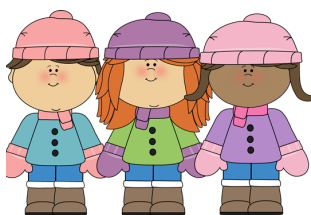
