

Religious Education

We offer religious education for children of registered parishioners who attend public school grades 1 thru 8. Preparation for the Sacraments of First Penance, First Holy Communion and Confirmation is also provided for students who attend Catholic schools. The Confirmation Program is a two-year preparation program. Students may not enroll into 8th grade, unless they complete our 7th grade program or attend a Catholic school. Difficulty Hearing in Church?

We understand that some parishioners may have difficulty hearing while in church and are looking into assistive device technology at the church to help address this. If you have difficulty with this, we'd appreciate your input:

- 1. What difficulty are you experiencing?
 - A. Is it loud enough (volume)?
 - B. If loud enough, is it still difficult to understand?
- 2. Do you wear a hearing aid or have a cochlear implant? (yes or no). If yes:
 - A. Is it equipped with a T-Coil (Telecoil)?
 - B. Is it equipped with Blue-tooth?
 - C. Is it equipped with both T-Coil and Blue-tooth?
- 4. Would you be open to wearing an additional device while in the church (perhaps a neck loop with a small receiver) around your neck to hear better?


Word of God Sunday


In 2019, Pope Francis instituted Word of God Sunday to be celebrated on the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time each year. According to his Apostolic Letter "Aperuit Illis", the day "is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God."

After all Masses this weekend, please pick up a copy of "Exodus" as a gift from the parish. The Exodus or the going out from Egypt lies at the very heart of Israel's faith experience. The God who acted on her behalf was not an insignificant deity of the ancient Near East cut off from reality and relegated to the realm of mythical time. Rather, God dramatically entered the arena of real time and real people. As the introduction puts it, "I, the Lord, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery" (Exodus 20:2).




