Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

As we begin this month traditionally dedicated to acknowledging all for which we should be thankful, I am pleased and grateful to share with you the parish's Annual Stewardship Report for the fiscal year 2023-2024. Once again, I believe this report represents a robust faith community.

A parish's vitality can be measured in many ways. Foremost, a parish should be a place where its members are encouraged to grow in their faith in and experience of Jesus Christ. We continue to aspire to prayerful and inspiring liturgies and opportunities for growth in faith (Parish Monthly Gatherings, Eucharistic adoration, Advent and Lent companions); more than 30 volunteer catechists and aides give of their time and their own faith-experience each week sharing our Catholic faith with our children; we now have a thriving ministry to our seventh graders through high-schoolers; currently, five adults are in the processing of entering the Catholic Church or receiving First Eucharist and Confirmation (OCIA).

"This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (Jn 13:35). Last year, St. Mary's continued its long tradition of outreach beyond our parish boundaries to those in need: from assistance to women choosing life for their children (Center for Great Expectation, Life Choices) and those lacking food and other basic needs (Somerset County Food Bank), to support for those grieving the loss of a loved one, to aid to victims of natural disasters, to collections of food, toys, winter coats and other clothing items for those living on the peripheries. Our Knights of Columbus Council deserves special praise for their contributions to many of these efforts.

In terms of our financial health: St. Mary's ended the fiscal year with \$\$69,525 in revenue over expenses. Contributing to this outcome were increases in our weekly collection (7.1%) and our Christmas (12.5%), and Easter collections (28.6%), along with a generous bequest and one-time gifts. Bequests and special gifts are always a critical element in keeping the Parish in the "black." I know that many parishes emphasize the importance of remembering the parish with a planned gift in gratitude for graces received through their parish over the years. Perhaps you might want to consider St. Mary's in your will after all family and loved ones have been taken care of.

Of course, our physical plant continues to age and, as you know, we face the replacement of HVAC systems in the church and the office/classroom areas of the Parish Center. Please know that we are working diligently to ensure we avail ourselves of competitive bids and programs that offer rebates and financing. There will undoubtedly be unanticipated expenses over the next twelve months.

I am most grateful for your commitment to St. Mary's, whether it be through your time, talent, treasure, or all three. I once again pledge that the parish staff and I will be good stewards of your thoughtfulness and generosity. May Our Lord, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Maty, our patroness, abundantly bless you and all you love.





Operating Revenue Overview -\$1,018,554

- Collections are 70% of parish revenue
- Special donations, bequests & offerings (including candle offertory) are 16.3% of parish revenue.
- Rental income is 8.5% of parish revenue.
- The parish received a \$8,708 rebate for our over-goal Bishop's Appeal efforts.
- \$36,001 or 3.5% of parish revenue is collected in Religious Education fees.

Operating Expense Overview -\$947,629

- Compensation includes clergy & clergy-related expenses and benefits, lay salaries & benefits, and taxes.
- The Diocesean Assessment is \$120,900
- Liturgy and Worship of \$43,006 or 4.5% is the daily and weekend liturgies cost.
- Religious Education Expenses include the cost associated with the BOLD Youth Ministry program, which has been funded by a generous donor.

Note: Major Renovations are NOT included in the calculation of Net Operating Income; these expenses are capitalized. Net Operating Income represents the parish's operating income and expenses.
