



Conduct in Cemetery

[Owner: Cemeteries Administrative Operations Manager]

13-A Idling, loafing, loitering, or any boisterous demonstration within the Cemetery or any of its buildings is prohibited.

13-B PAPER, RUBBISH, ETC. – Throwing of rubbish, flowers, and weeds on roads, driveways, paths, walks, or any part of the grounds or in the buildings is prohibited. Receptacles for waste materials are located at convenient places.

13-C PICNICKING – Picnicking or partaking of any refreshment by visitors within the Cemetery is prohibited.

13-D PHOTOGRAPHY – No one shall be permitted to use camera or video equipment including the use of personal cellular telephones and devices for professional use or to be published, on the Cemetery grounds, without the express written permission of Cemetery Management.

13-E FLOWERS AND SHRUBS – No one shall pluck any flower or break any branches, or remove, injure, or cut any tree, plant, or shrub without specific permission of the Management.

13-F PEDDLING OR SOLICITING – No one shall be permitted to peddle flowers, plants, or any other articles or item, or to solicit funds for any purpose whatsoever within the Cemetery unless authorized by the Management and under its direct supervision.

13-G SIGNS AND ADVERTISING – No signs, notices, or advertising of any kind shall be allowed within the Cemetery except those placed there by management.

13-H IMPROPER ASSEMBLAGES – The Management reserves the right to forbid and prevent assemblages which it deems improper or unbecoming to a Catholic Cemetery.

13-I No person or persons, other than an agent of Management, or an employee authorized by Management, shall be permitted to bring or carry firearms within the Cemetery except a Military guard or honor and then only when in charge of an officer and during a Military Service.

13-J FLOWER REMOVAL – Visitors should not remove flowers or decorations from any grave they do not have right in.

13-K THEFT – All memorials, including family mausoleums, monuments, markers, or vases are the property of the individual owner. Therefore, any damage to memorials due to weather, Acts of God, vandalism, malicious mischief, or theft is the owner's responsibility. Please contact your local insurance agency to include your property on your home owner's policy.
