From the Desk of Sister Sally: Can you relate to any of the following in the Gospel story?



- Confusion of the disciples
- Inability to recognize Jesus
- Desire to spend more time with a good friend
- Sudden realization that the Lord is present

In section 3 of Pope Francis' address to the Bishops of Brazil he suggests a Church rooted in the Gospel story of Emmaus. The disciples ended up with hearts burning. What makes your heart "burn" within you?

We need a Church unafraid of going forth into their night. We need a church capable of meeting them on their way. We need a Church capable of entering into their conversation. We need a Church able to dialogue with those disciples who, having left Jerusalem behind, are wandering aimlessly, alone, with their own disappointment, disillusioned by a Christianity now considered barren, fruitless soil, incapable of generating meaning. ...

But we need to know how to interpret, with courage, the larger picture. Jesus warmed the hearts of the disciples of Emmaus.

St, Gianna Beretta Molla was a wife, mother and pediatrician who lived from 1922 to 1962. When pregnant with her fourth child, severe complications set in. As a result, the doctors wanted to perform an abortion and a hysterectomy in order to save Gianna's life. Gianna, however, just opted for the removal of the tumor only, wanting to save the life of her baby. The pregnancy continued on with more complications. Even with a difficult delivery, Gianna made it clear that she wanted the baby saved. "If you must choose between me and the baby, no hesitation; choose---and I demand it---the baby. Save the baby!" Gianna died seven days after giving birth.

At her canonization Mass, St. John Paul II called Gianna "a simple, but more than ever, significant messenger of divine love."

St. Gianna pray for all unborn babies and their mothers.

St . Gianna's feast day is April 28th.

We will be participating in a regional **Summer Madness** program this summer from July 31st – Aug. 4th. It is an opportunity for Middle School students (current 6th-8th graders in the 2016/2017 school year) to take part in service activities, meet students from other parishes (make new friends), and have fun. Each day (Monday - Thursday) the students will go to a different service site in the morning and help serve. They will return for lunch together, and then we'll all go have fun in the afternoon (bowling, laser-tag, minigolf, etc.). On Friday, Aug. 4th, we'll all go to Hershey Park for the day (the Hershey Park trip is ONLY open to students who are participating in Summer Madness). Summer Madness cannot happen without parents helping (Child Protection trained and cleared parents). High School Youth Ministry

Our **Sunday evening faith formation meetings will be on break** until the Fall, but our Wed. Night Group meets year-round for faith formation, so consider joining us! See the description and schedule below.

Our **Spring Retreat** was April 21st -23rd. 39 of us went to Camp Letts in Edgewater, MD and our theme was "Why Am I Catholic and What Does It Matter?" We reflected on...Why do I exist? (Do I believe in God?); Who am I? (Why am I a Christian?); and What am I supposed to do with my life? (Why am I Catholic?);...and What does it matter? Catholicism, our faith, is our pathway to peace, joy, and wholeness...the Way Jesus offered us to eternal happiness. And while we reflected, we has a great time together...we worked together, played together, and worshiped together. Fr. Raff even came out Sunday morning and celebrated Mass with us. Thanks for all your prayers.

Finally, again this summer we are sending teams out for our <u>Work Camp trips</u>. One team will be heading into Baltimore City (June 18-24), and one team will be going to Terra Alta, West Virginia (June 25-July 1); teams from OLC consist of at least 5 students and 2 adults. Our teams will be joining many other students from parishes around the Archdiocese of Baltimore to perform "Habitat for Humanity" type work for the week. Flyers have been e-mailed to parents and are available in the box on the Business Office door in the church lobby. The expenses for the Baltimore and Appalachia trips are \$350 per person. For both work camp trips, we're asking the students to pay for part of their expenses (\$175), and we're hoping parishioners will consider sponsoring students for the remainder of their expenses (\$175 per student, although partial sponsorship is also welcome). We have asked this of you in years past, and you have supported us amazingly; we are grateful! We know things are tight in this economy, but this is a worthwhile investment!
