Saint Mary has resumed public mass in Milan. However, our bishop and government officials require us to observe several public health procedures. If you plan to attend mass, you must have no COVID symptoms. You need to wear your mask entering and leaving, but not while in your pew, pass a temperature check, use hand sanitizer at the church entrance. Individuals living in the same house or family units may sit together, others must remain six feet apart. Those at risk during this crisis, especially those age 65 or older, should strongly consider using the dispensation. Streaming each week's liturgy continues at stmary.church/masses or [facebook.com/stmary.life](https://www.facebook.com/stmary.life).

Because of public health regulations, we may not be able to seat everyone who wishes to attend mass. We will do our best to avoid this circumstance, but it is possible we will be compelled by regulations to restrict admittance.

Aquellos en riesgo durante esta crisis, especialmente aquellos de 65 años o más, deben considerar usar la dispensación. From Deacon John...

When we take our eyes off God, we lose perspective of the value of God's presence. Our trust and focus wander to things of less import. Our priorities shift and we fail to achieve the potential God hoped for us. Today we read that Peter makes this same serious mistake. Jesus sends the disciples in a boat ahead of Him. Later, he strolls up to the boat, walking on the sea. Doubting his eyes, Peter says, "Lord if it is you, command me to come to you on the water," and Jesus responds, "Come." Peter steps out onto the water, but distracted and frightened by the wind and sea, he takes his eyes off Jesus. In that instant, he sinks. But what if Peter had not turned away? Imagine walking with Jesus! It is the same for us. If we wander away from Christ, crisis is never far behind. Like Peter, we soon sink. But if we remain, what joy lies ahead.

Pedro, dudando de sus ojos, dice: "Señor, si eres tú, mándame que vaya a ti sobre el agua", y Jesús responde: "Ven". Pedro sale al agua, pero distraído y asustado por el viento y el mar, aparta los ojos de Jesús. En ese instante, se hunde. Pero, ¿y si Peter no se hubiera alejado? ¡Imagínese caminando con Jesús! Es lo mismo para nosotros. Si nos alejamos de Cristo, la crisis nunca se queda atrás. Como Peter, pronto nos hundimos. Pero si nos quedamos, qué alegría nos espera.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today's Gospel directly follows last week's account of Jesus feeding a crowd of more than 5,000 people with just five loaves of bread and two fish. For the sake of the crowds, Jesus had postponed his time of solitude. Now, at last, Jesus finds some time for quiet and prayer. He sends his disciples ahead of him by boat, dismisses the crowds, and then withdraws to the mountain to pray.

The disciples do not fare well. They struggle to weather the wind and waves, making little progress in their journey. We are reminded of a previous story in Chapter 8 of Matthew's Gospel, when Jesus calms the seas. This time, however, Jesus does not calm the seas, and the disciples do not express fear until they see Jesus walking toward them on the water. In this story it is not the storm that is feared but the sight of Jesus before them, whom they mistake for a ghost.

Clues like these suggest that this story is about the disciples' growing understanding of the identity of Jesus. In continuity with last week's Gospel about the feeding of the multitude, today's

Gospel is also about what the disciples' faith in Jesus will enable them to do. In last week's Gospel, when the disciples see the crowds, they ask Jesus to send the crowds away. Jesus turns the situation around, telling the disciples to feed the crowd with the provisions that they have. Both of these Gospels tell us much about ministry.

Jesus calls to the disciples and calms their fears. He is not a ghost. The impulsive Peter seeks proof that the person is indeed Jesus. He asks Jesus to call him out onto the water, and Jesus grants this request. Peter's fear and doubt overtake him, however, once he is walking on the water. Jesus reaches out to Peter and saves him. When Jesus and Peter enter the boat, Matthew

reports that the wind ceases, and the disciples confess that Jesus is the Son of God.

Faith in Jesus will enable the disciples to do the work that Jesus has done. Peter walks on water. The five loaves and two fish feed a multitude of people. The disciples can and will participate in the work of the kingdom of heaven. When Peter fears and doubts the person of Jesus, however, he falters. Peter's example teaches us that true Christian ministry emerges from the faith that Jesus is the Messiah, God's only Son.

Family Connection

The mission of the Church is to continue the work of Jesus. The family, the domestic church, participates in this mission too. Discuss ways to reach out to your neighbors and people in need. Talk about how Peter wanted to walk on water like Jesus did. Peter was successful for a time, but then he doubted Jesus, and he began to sink.
