IXL is a comprehensive learning program offering unlimited math, language arts, science, and social studies practice across thousands of skills—all of which are aligned to state standards. We have used it throughout the year as a reinforcement.

You MUST have a score of 100% OR spend 20 minutes or more with a score of 80% or above in the skill in order to receive credit for completion of the Summer Assignment!

To get your child started on your home computer, please follow these easy steps:

1. Go to <https://www.ixl.com/signin/stjohnvi>
2. Enter your child's username and password and click "Sign in."
(Note: Same username and password they have used all school year)
3. In the top right you will a star with "Suggestions from your teacher" or go to the "recommendations tab" under Learning

IXL is designed to help your child learn at their own pace. The program is adaptive and will adjust based on your child's demonstrated understanding of the material. All of your child's results will be saved, so you can monitor their progress anytime by clicking on Analytics. For on-the-go practice, you can download IXL's free mobile apps for Apple, Android, or Kindle and sign in with your child's username and password.

Dear Incoming 7th Graders,

This summer we would like you to read two age-appropriate books of your choosing. In addition to that, we encourage you to read as many books as you want and to choose books you think you'll enjoy. You may choose **one** title per specific author or genre (You may read **one** R.L. Stine book or **one** book about sports.). Your choice should be age-appropriate yet challenging. It is strongly suggested that you try different types of books, such as science fiction, western, and mysteries. . Series books are an acceptable choice; however, you may only read one book in each series. There are no specific books on a reading list.

In addition to reading two books, you must complete TWO book reports.

PLEASE INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN YOUR BOOK REPORT(S)

1. The book report should be one to two pages typed, double-spaced, Times New Roman 12pt font, with standard margins
2. Your document must have the proper single-spaced SJV heading
3. **Parent Signature** – The signature assures your teacher that you have not already read the book and that you have completed the assignment. **Please sign next to each title.**
4. Title (underlined or *italicized*)
5. Author
6. Publisher (This should be a company, not a person's name)
7. Copyright date
8. Type of book (genre)
9. **In two well-written paragraphs**, summarize the plot of the book including the ending. If the book is non-fiction, briefly describe what the book is about. Please remember that a paragraph is at least seven sentences and not more than twelve. Only important information about the story's action should be included. The paragraph should not be overly descriptive or include conversations among characters.
10. & 11. **Choose TWO of the following questions and answer each in two to three complete sentences.**
 1. Why did you choose to read this book?
 2. Write a brief statement that will convince your classmates to read this book.
 3. What did you like about this book?
 4. What did you dislike about this book?
 5. If you could change something about this book, what would it be and why?
 6. What qualities did you admire in the main character?
 7. How are you like the main character?
