To get your child started on your home computer, please follow these easy steps:

1. Go to <https://www.ixl.com/signin/stjohnvi>
2. Enter your child's username and password and click "Sign in."
(Note: Same username and password they have used all school year)
3. In the top right you will a star with "Suggestions from your teacher" or go to the "recommendations tab" under Learning

IXL is designed to help your child learn at their own pace. The program is adaptive and will adjust based on your child's demonstrated understanding of the material. All of your child's results will be saved, so you can monitor their progress anytime by clicking on Analytics. For on-the-go practice, you can download IXL's free mobile apps for Apple, Android, or Kindle and sign in with your child's username and password.

When you complete the book, you will choose one of the following projects to complete.

1. Create an **original** book cover for the book. It should not be a recreation of an existing book cover.

The cover must include the title and the author's name. You may create the cover by drawing or digitally using Canva, etc., but if you create the cover digitally you **MUST** turn in a print out that is printed **at home**.

On the back of the cover, you should include a one paragraph summary (without the ending) that explains what the book is about and gets someone excited to read it. You should also include 1-2 sentence reviews of the book, as you often see on an actual book cover. This may be a separate typed page attached to the back of your book design.

OR

2. Write a 30 question test for your book, **including an answer key**. Your test must include 10 multiple choice questions, 10 matching or true/false questions, and 10 short answer questions which are answered in complete sentences. You must create your document like a test would be given to you.
