DURABLE JUBILATION

Today's first reading ends telling us that as the apostles left the council, "they rejoiced that they were considered worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the Name." So, there it stands as exhibit A, a clear case of cross-bearing and triumph-sharing. Today's second reading records a revelation of unmitigated triumph and praise. This middle reading, the intervening chants and the closing words of the first reading all speak of a durable jubilation among God's people as they face the task at hand. Their joy changes mourning into dancing and turns back the long night's weeping.

PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY




