Sun Safety - Slip Slather & Slap!!

Eighty percent of total lifetime sun exposure happens before the age of 18. Sunburn is a clear sign that DNA in your skin cells has been damaged by too much UV radiation. Parents need to start sun safety early with their children, and teach them good habits.

Sun safety is a year round issue, even on a cloudy day. Spring is upon us and the kids love to be outdoors. Sunscreen of 15 SPF is adequate in preventing sunburns in the majority of cases. Sunglasses and t-shirts and hats can add even more protection. So slip on a shirt, slather on the sunscreen, and slap on a hat. Remember to reapply sunscreen if swimming or sweating a lot!

Everyone should also be aware of changes in the number, shape, size or color of skin spots or moles. Also, watch for moles that bleed, itch or have changed. These may also be cancerous.

Remember – 90% of all skin cancers can be prevented by protection from the sun's UV rays.
