Pastor's Corner: Why must the Messiah die? Despite a few mysterious prophetic texts that seemed to intimate this possibility, the idea that the Messiah could arrive and subsequently be killed was radically counterintuitive to most of first-century Jews.

Yet the conviction of the early Christians, based on Jesus of Nazareth's own teachings about himself, was that the radically counterintuitive impossibility was actually prophesied, if one had the eyes to see and the ears to hear it in Israel's Scriptures.

The readings for this Mass offer us two of the most poignant prophecies of the suffering of the Messiah. Taken from The Word of the Lord; Reflection on the Mass readings. ~ God Bless, Fr. John
