Pastor's Corner Belief in the resurrection of the dead has always been a threat to the power of the wealthy elite who run society, as the Sadducees were. If there is a resurrection from the dead, then this life is not all that there is, and there may be something worth dying for. People who are willing to die for truth are hard to manipulate over long periods of time. People whose only hope is for this life are easier for the elite to control because making their lives miserable right now is usually enough to dissuade them from rebellion. So the elite of our age are similarly against the populace entertaining notions of eternal life and Final Judgment.

This week I'm reminded of a phrase from Matt Wennerstrom, one of the young men who risked their lives to save people during a mass shooting at a bar in Thousand Oaks, California in November 2018. Matt said in an interview afterwards: "I know where I'm going when I die, so I was not worried to sacrifice." Such men are willing to oppose not only masked gunmen but also corrupt political powers.
