**PASTOR'S CORNER:** Ash Wednesday ~ Holy Mother Church calls us to begin the Great Fast in preparation for Easter.

The most famous of penitential psalms is attributed to David on the occasion of his adultery with Bathsheba and murder of Uriah, Bathsheba's husband and a high -ranking commander in David's army. This incredible betrayal of God's law by the one who, as sacred king, was responsible for the proclamation and enforcement of God's justice and righteousness in the kingdom gave rise to the most profound expression of sorrow for sin in world literature. On this day of penitence in the liturgical calendar, we all become David, and like him, acknowledge to God that "Against you only have I sinned." This is not a literal statement, but typical Hebrew hyperbole that expresses the concept: "Whoever else I may have offended, I recognize that all sin is directed ultimately and primarily against you, O God."

The flood of Noah illustrates a pattern in salvation history of God's mercy being greater than his justice. Although God justly could have ended the history of the earth with the flood, nonetheless he has mercy on man and animals by going to great lengths to spare representatives of each kind, then offers to them a new covenant at the end of the time of judgment, a new covenant which includes a solemn commitment to no longer punish in that same way.

Sin can be defined as selfishness or also as breaking the covenant. Sin is what separates us from God - indeed, the only thing that can separate us, because sin is in its essence a rejection of love, and God is love. Therefore, every sin is a rejection of God. And God is polite—he will not come where he is not wanted. So "Repent, and believe in the gospel," or, in the NRSVCE translation, "believe in the good news." What is the Good News? That the Kingdom of God has arrived on earth! That is still Good News today. God's kingdom has arrived, and one can join it, and it provides the means for the most intimate conceivable relationship of love with the creator of the Universe.
